

THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979
AMENDED ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The entry in the Schedule of monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under Section 1(1) of the above Act in respect of the monument formerly known as Keiss Castle, Caithness, dated 28 December 1934 and recorded in the Division of the General Register of Sasines for the County of Caithness on 7 January 1935 and now to be known as Keiss Castle, 350m SSE of Square of Keiss is hereby in accordance with the provisions of section 1(5) of the above Act amended to describe the area of the scheduled monument as being irregular in shape and as measuring a maximum of 42m E-W by a maximum of 18m N-S. It is defined by the inner side of the modern fence to the NW and by the top edge of the cliff on the other sides. It includes the castle, the revetted sides of the promontory, and an area of ground between the castle and the modern fence as shown delineated in red on the plan annexed and executed as relative hereto.

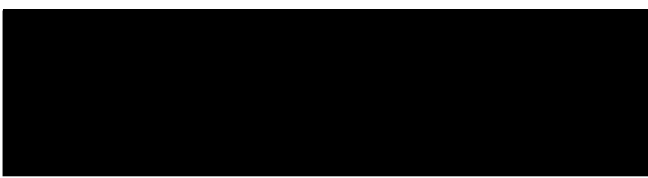
