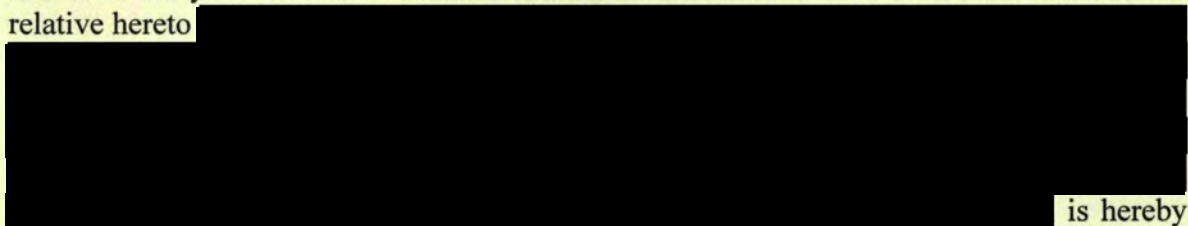


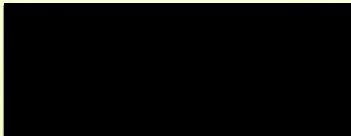

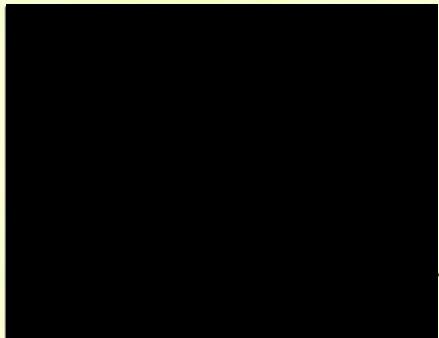

The monument known as Range Castle, fort, comprises the remains of a multi-period hillfort, visible as a series of ramparts, ditches, counterscarps and a stone wall. The construction of the fort is likely to date from the late first millennium BC or early first millennium AD. The fort lies on the northernmost peak of a ridge on the W side of the valley of the River Annan, at 195m above sea level. The area to be scheduled is irregular on plan, to include the remains described and an area around them within which related material may be expected to be found. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Dalton and the County of Dumfries as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

 is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

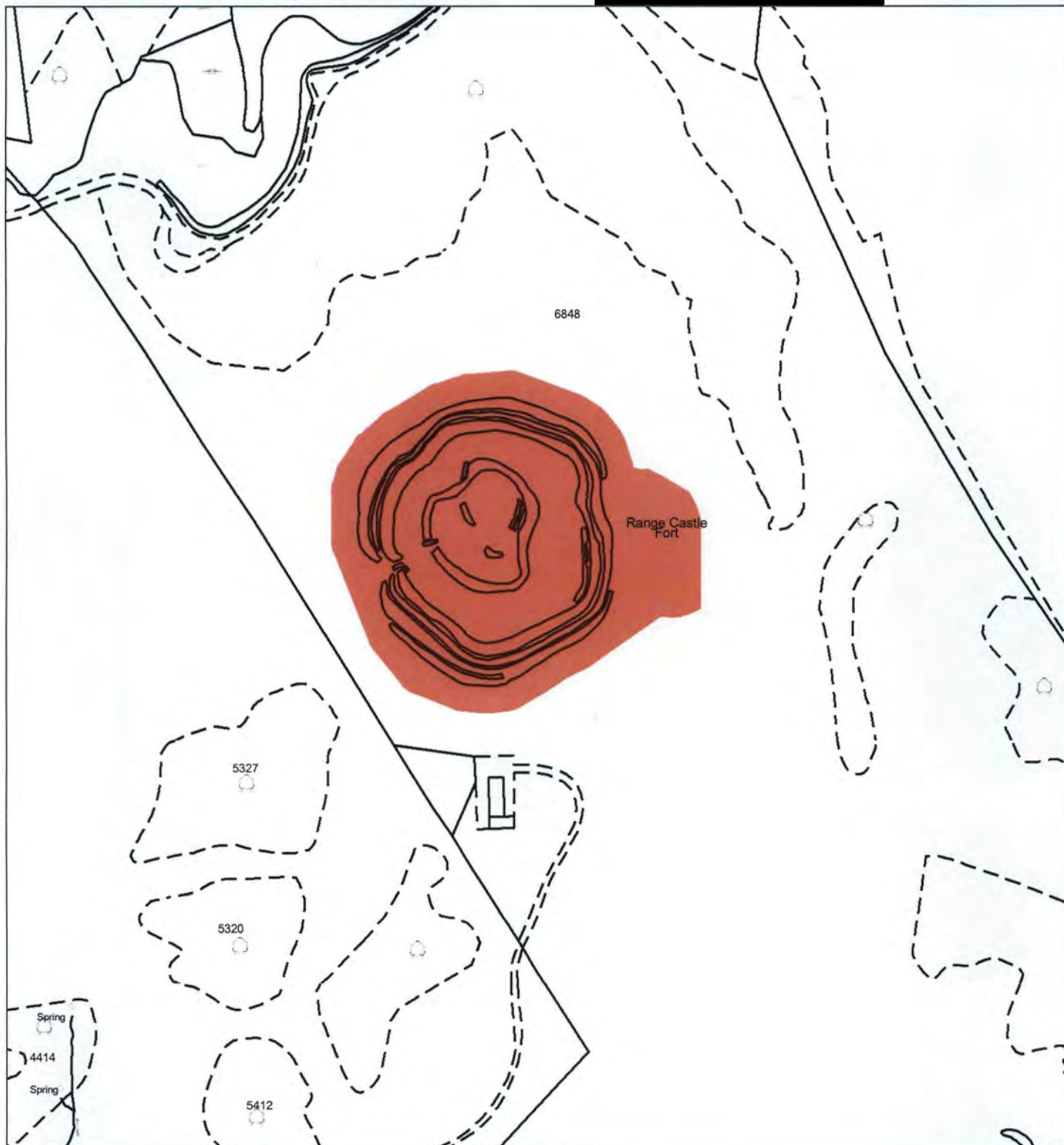

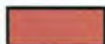
