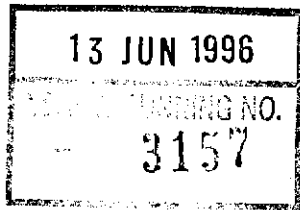

ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Durisdeer, Roman fortlet between Dash Cleuch and Kirk Burn comprises the well-preserved remains of a Roman fortlet, set beside what may be a Roman road. The area to be scheduled is oval, some 90m NE-SW by 65m, to include the fortlet, its ditch and outer bank, and the titulus to the NE. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Durisdeer and the County of Dumfries as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

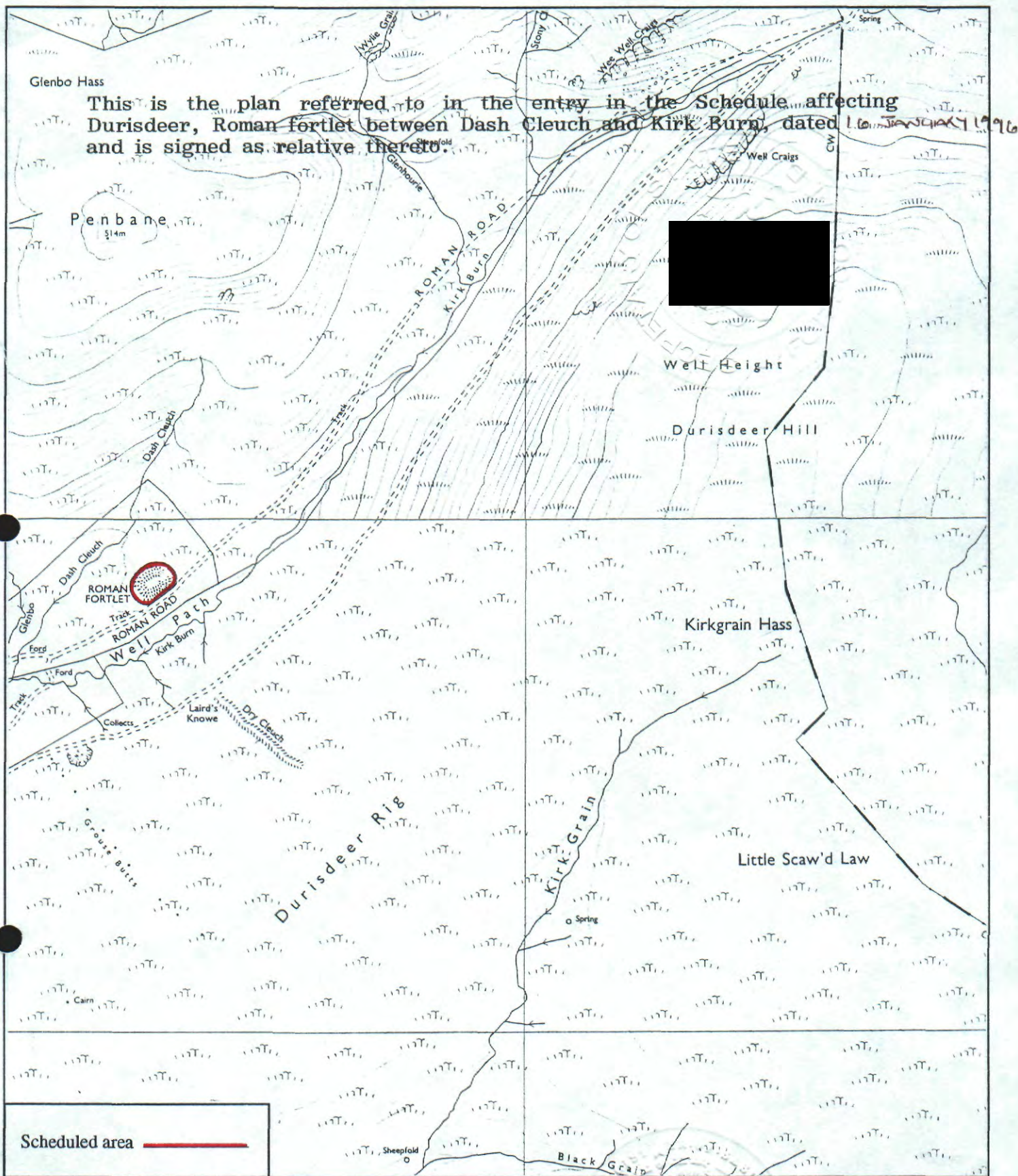
