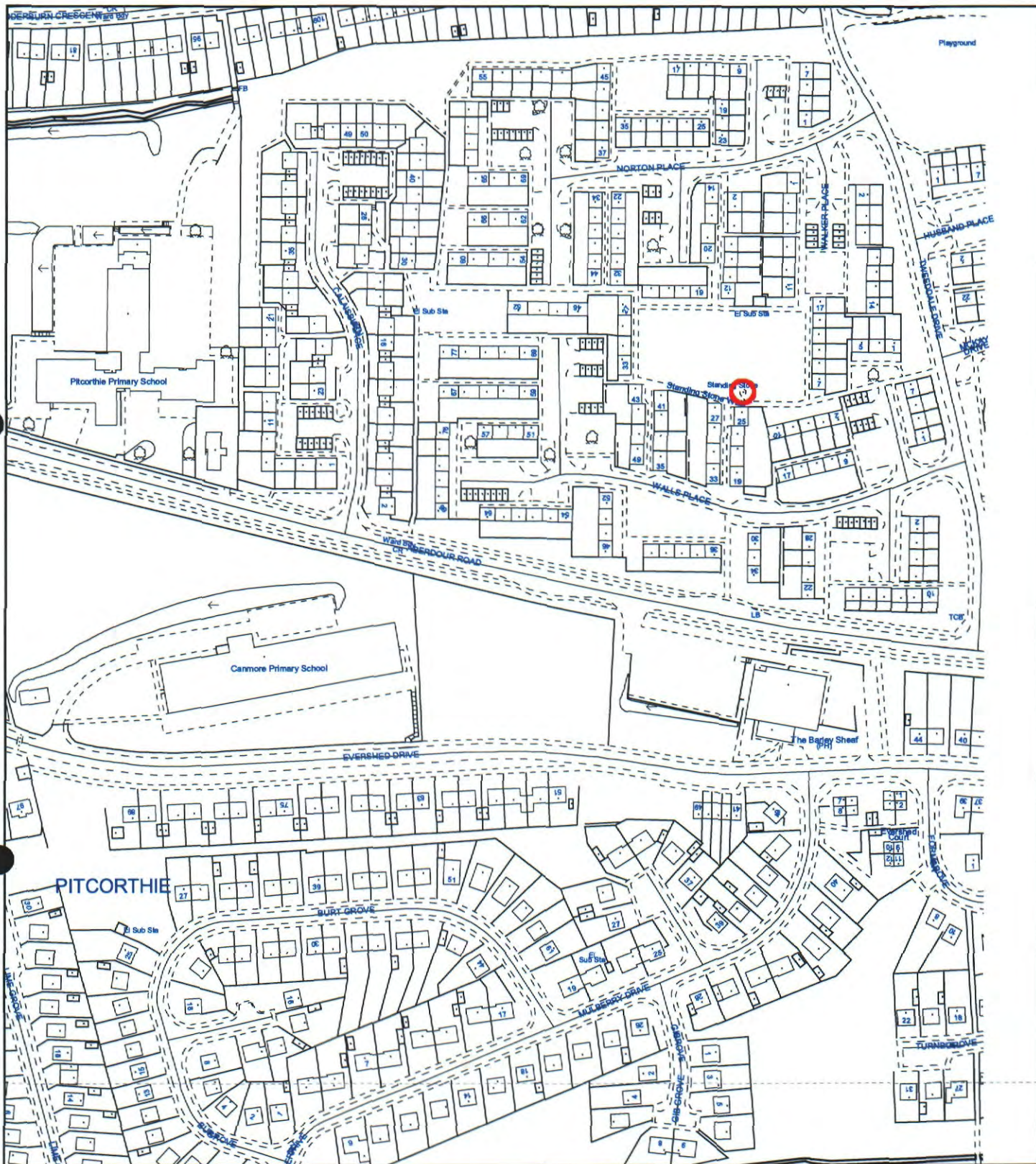
The monument known as Easter Pitcorthie, standing stone, Standing Stone Walk, Dunfermline comprises a standing stone which originally stood on the crest of slightly rising ground. Its modern setting is within an area paved with granite setts, adjacent to Standing Stone Walk in the Pitcorthie estate, Dunfermline. The area to be scheduled is a circle 10m in diameter, to include the stone and an area around it in which evidence relating to its construction and use may survive. The scheduling includes the pavement of granite setts around the stone, as this cannot be maintained or removed without potential damage to the stone and any associated deposits. The surface of Standing Stone Walk is excluded from the scheduling to allow for its routine maintenance. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Dunfermline and the County of Fife as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto [REDACTED] Register of Scotland under T [REDACTED] Special Housing Association Limited, Pitreavie Business Park, Dunfermline), is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.
