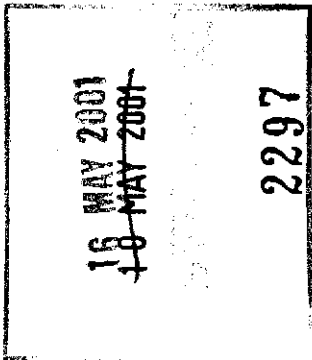

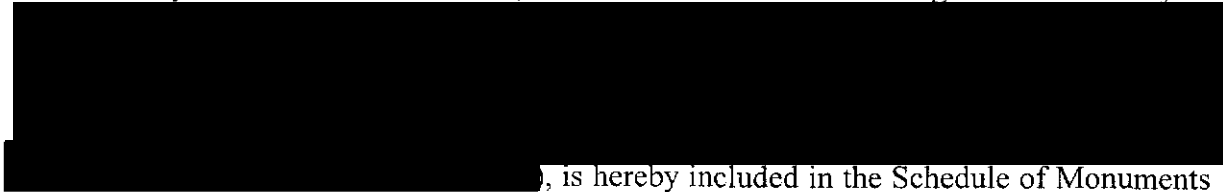

ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Standing Stones of Lundin, Lundin Links comprises three irregular standing stones, set within 16m of each other, in an area which produced rich archaeological remains in the 18th and 19th centuries. The area to be scheduled is a circle of 40m in diameter centred on a point equidistant between the single N stone and the S pair, to include all three stones and an area of ground in which evidence relating to their erection and use may survive. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Largo and the County of
