the owner of the Monument known as the fort occupying an irregular area of ground on the summit of Norman's Law near Luthrie, bounded on the north and north-east by the cliff on the north side of said Law along which it extends 210 yards and 70 yards respectively and measuring from its eastmost point to its south-eastmost point 140 yards in a south-west by south direction, from its south-eastmost point to its south-westmost point 280 yards measuring in a straight line in a west by south direction and from its south-westmost point to its north-westmost point 280 yards following the curve in a general north-north-east direction, the north-westmost point of said area being situated 210 yards south by west of the Boundary between the Parishes of Dunbog and Flisk at its nearest point, 800 yards west by south of the junction of said Parish Boundary with the Boundary between the Parishes of Dunbog and Creich and 910 yards north by east of the north-east corner of Den Cottage, being the subjects indicated in red colour on the annexed plan and being part of the property known as Aytonhill Estate situated in the Parish of Dunbog and County of Fife.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 6 of the Ancient Monuments Act, 1931, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Works and Public Buildings hereby give you notice that it is their intention to include the Monument above specified in a list of monuments to be published by them under Section 12 of the Ancient Monuments Consolidation and Amendment Act, 1913.
