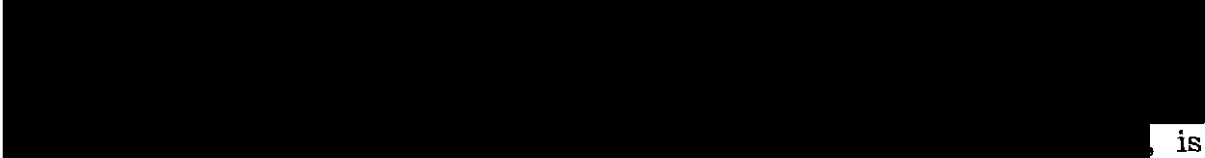

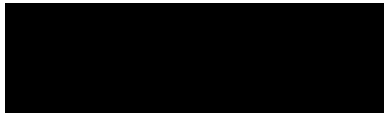
THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Sir Andrew Wood's Tower, Largo House comprises a circular tower, a fragment of a major sixteenth/seventeenth century house on the site of an earlier, documented, castle, and a small area around this tower. The area to be scheduled is rectangular, 50m E-W by 35m N-S, to include the tower and an area around, under which may lie remains of the residence and earlier castle. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Largo and the County of Fife as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto



is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

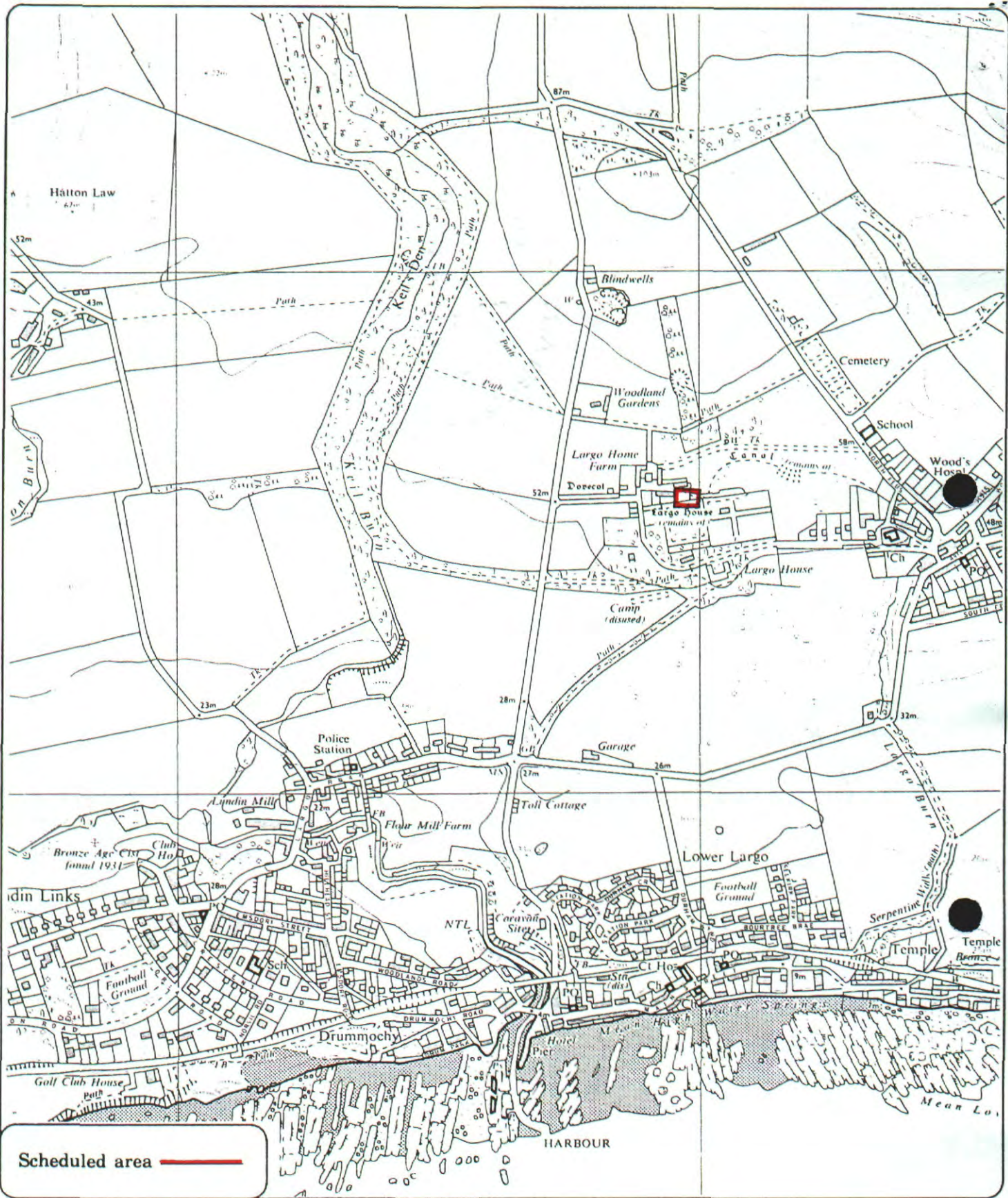

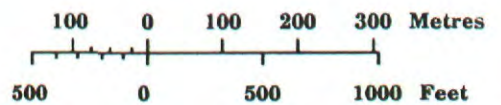
