ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Teampull Moire, churches, chapels and enclosures, Howmore comprises a large mound bearing the remains of a group of ecclesiastical structures, representing two churches, at least two chapels and two burial enclosures. The area to be scheduled is the whole flat-topped mound, including the remains of all the structures described above. It is an elongated oval, approximately 100m SW-NE by 60m NW-SE. The monument, which lies in the Parish of South Uist and the County of Inverness as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

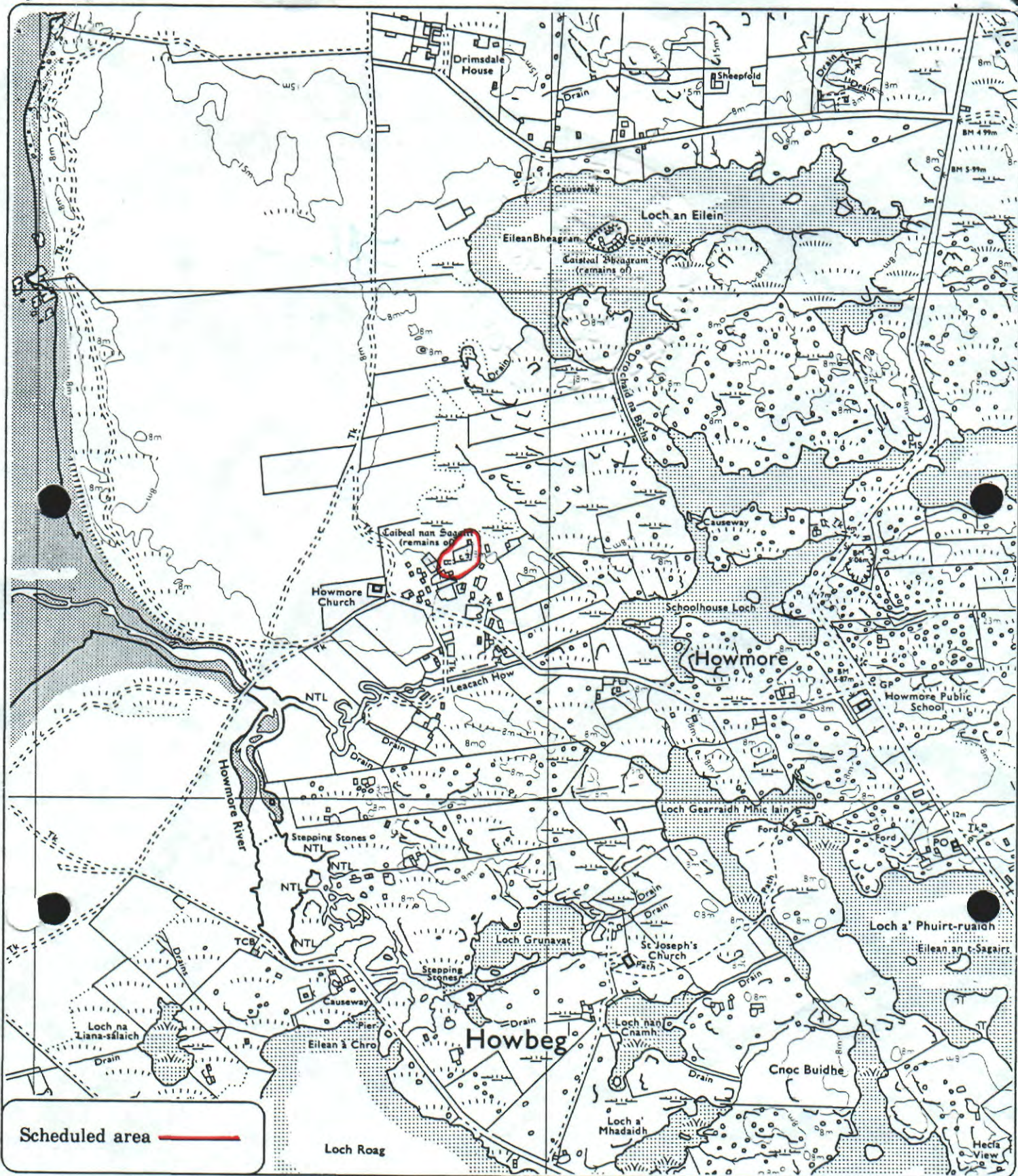
