



IN THE MATTER OF THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS ACTS, 1913 AND 1931.

[Redacted] the owner of the Monument known as "Unyatauk" occupying a circular area of ground 29 feet in diameter the northmost point of said area being situated 200 yards west of the south westmost gable at Bonnyhill, 367 yards south west by north of Bench Mark 155.0 on the south eastmost gable of Habreck and 350 yards north by west of Bench Mark 105.6 on the south eastmost gable of Lucknow

being the subjects indicated in red colour on the annexed plan and being part of the property known as the farm and lands of Onzie Tua

situated in the Parish of Shapinsay and County of Orkney.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 6 of the Ancient Monuments Act, 1931, the Minister of Works hereby give you notice that it is his intention to include the Monument above specified in a list of monuments to be published by him under Section 12 of the Ancient Monuments Consolidation and Amendment Act, 1913.

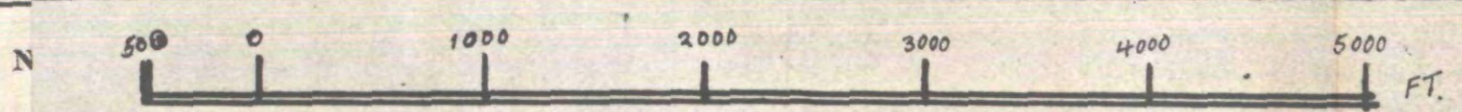
