ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Kempock Stone, Inverkip comprises a standing stone (1.8m high and 0.6m in diameter) which is situated within an enclosure on the top of a cliff overlooking Kempock Point. The area to be scheduled is triangular on plan and measures up to 1.8m across to include the stone and the area enclosed by the modern railings (but excluding their above ground structure). The monument, which lies in the Parish of Inverkip and the County of Renfrew as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

 is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

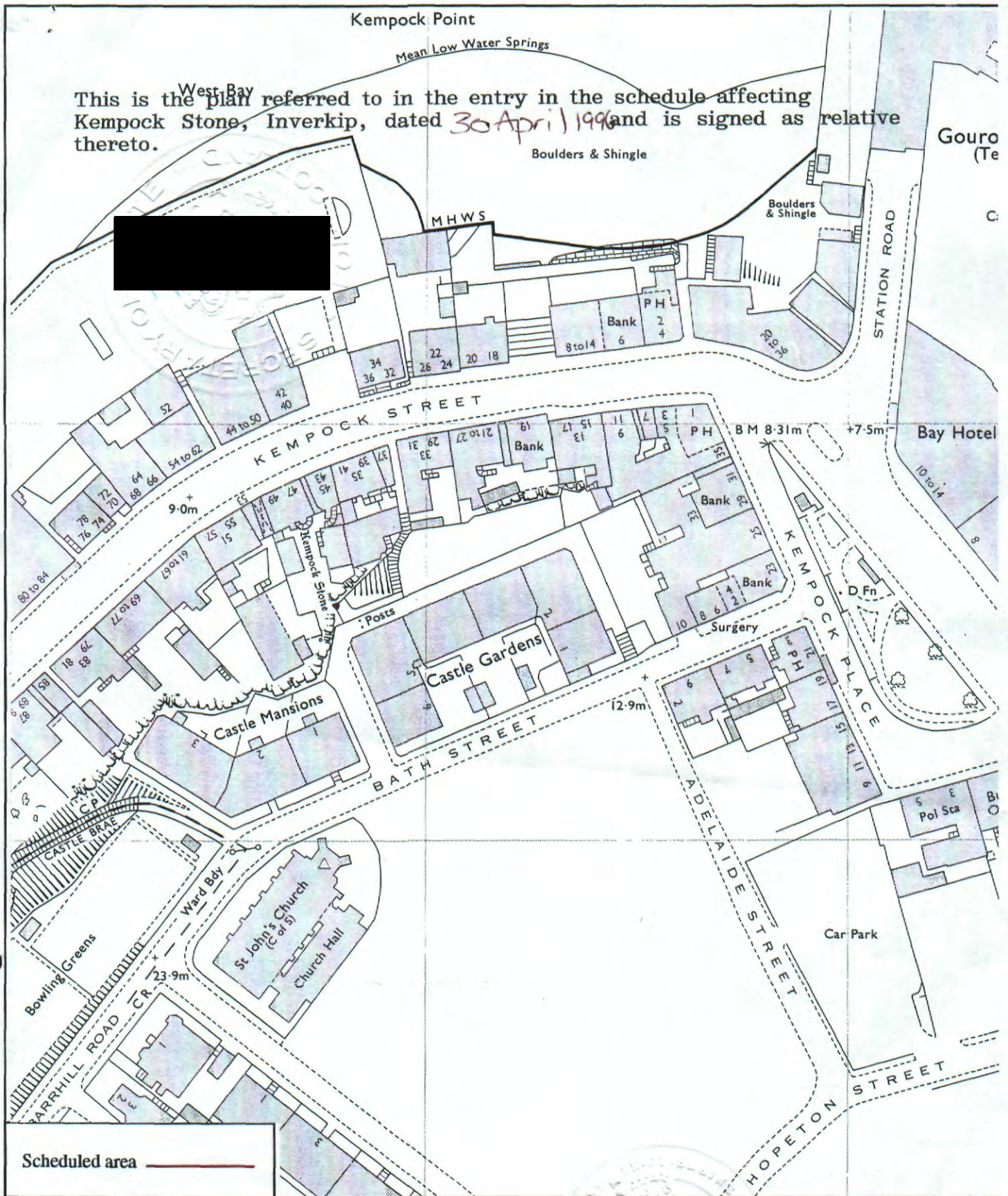

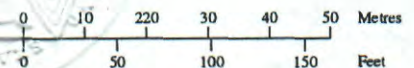


Kempock Stone, Inverkip
