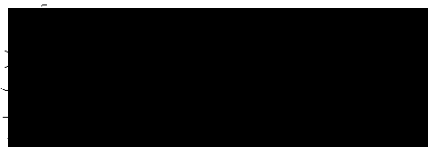

ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Dingwall Churchyard, symbol stone comprises a stone bearing cup marks and Pictish symbols. The area to be scheduled is a circle 2m in diameter, centred on the stone but excluding the surface of the modern path. It includes the symbol stone and a small portion of the burial ground. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Dingwall and the County of Ross and Cromarty as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto [REDACTED] is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

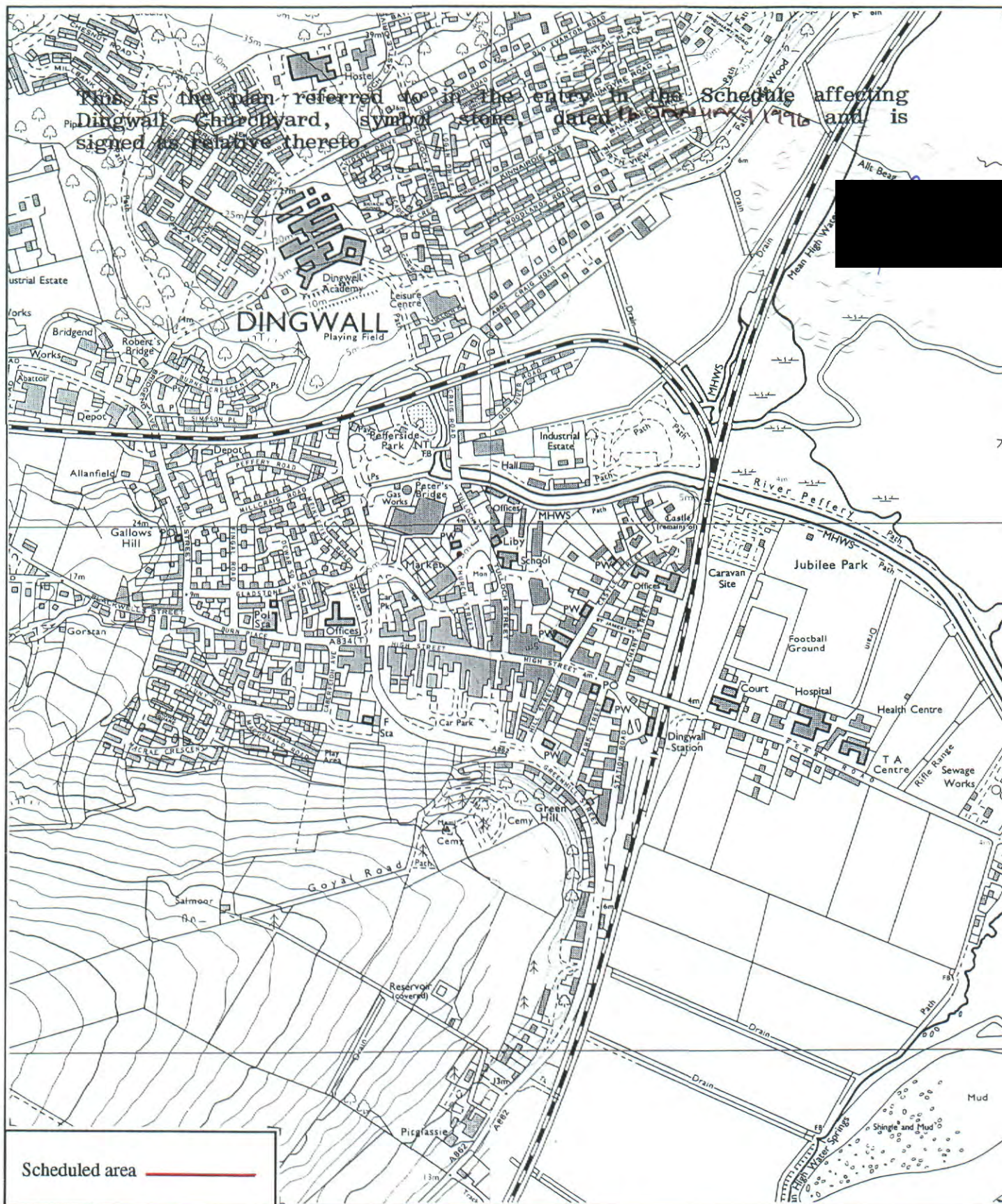

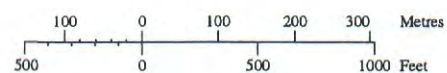
