The entry in the Schedule of monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the above Act in respect of the monument known as Mervinslaw Tower, dated 28 February and recorded in the Division of the General Register of Sasines for the County of Roxburgh on 20 April both in the year 1948 is hereby in accordance with the provisions of section 1(5) of the above Act amended to describe the area of the scheduled monument as measuring 100m NE-SW and 90m transversely as shown delineated in red on the plan annexed and executed as relative hereto.

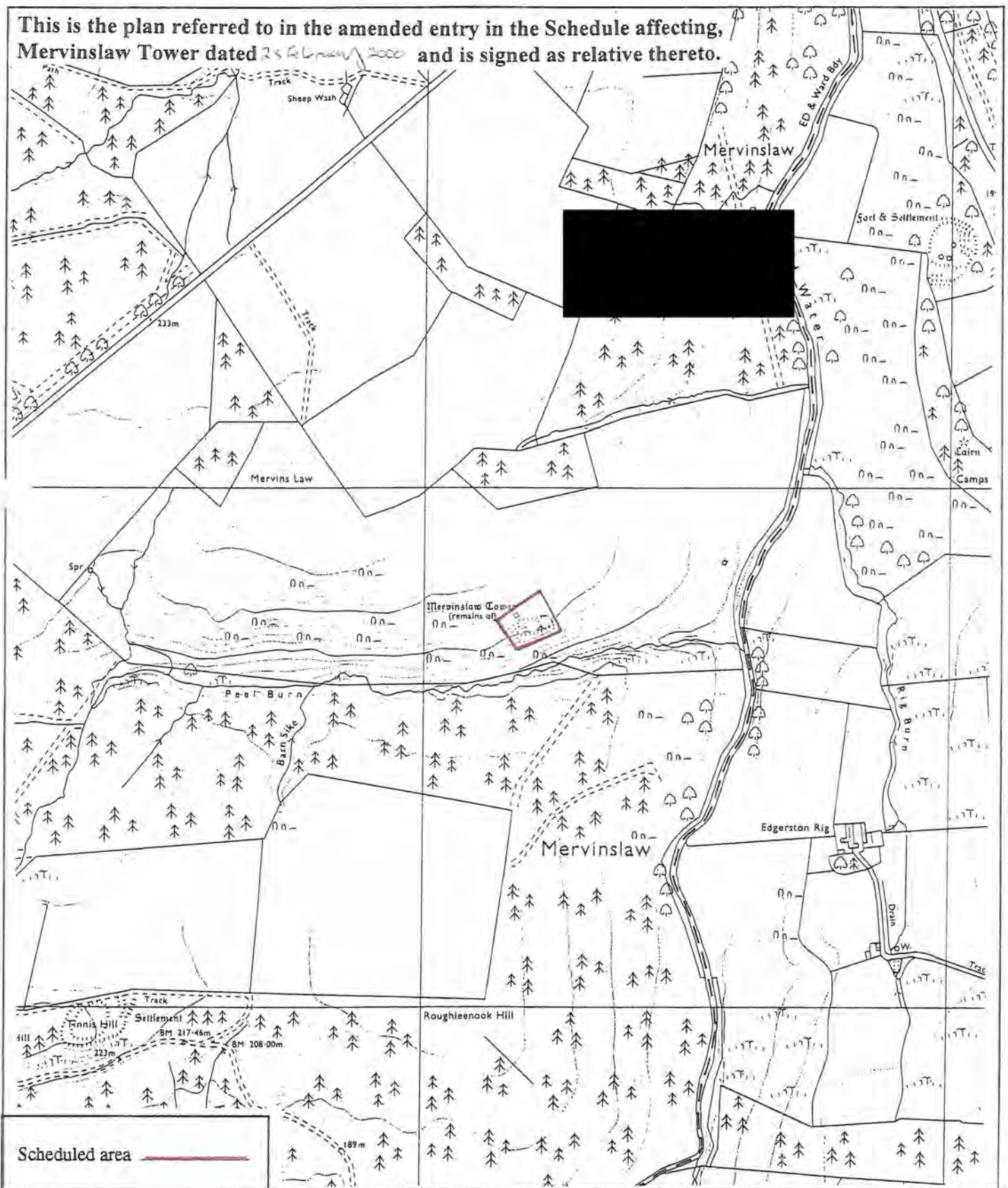

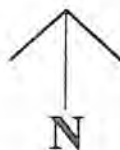

Scheduled area

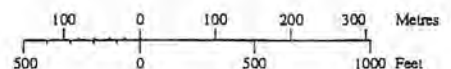
Mervinslaw Tower

the owners of the Monument known as Mervinslaw Tower contained within a rectangular area of ground measuring 26 feet or thereby from south east to north west and 22 feet or thereby from north east to south west, the east corner thereof being situated 320 feet or thereby north north west of the Peel Burn at its nearest point, 1380 feet or thereby west by north of the junction of the north or left bank of said Burn with the west or left bank of the Jed Water, and 2340 feet or thereby south west by west of the junction of a stream flowing eastwards from Mervinslaw with said water, being the subjects indicated in red colour on the annexed plan and being part of the property known as Farm and Lands of Mervinslaw situated in the Parish of Southdean and County of Roxburgh.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 6 of the Ancient Monuments Act, 1931, the Minister of Works hereby gives you notice that it is his intention to include the Monument above specified in a list of monuments to be published by him under Section 12 of the Ancient Monuments Consolidation and Amendment Act, 1913.

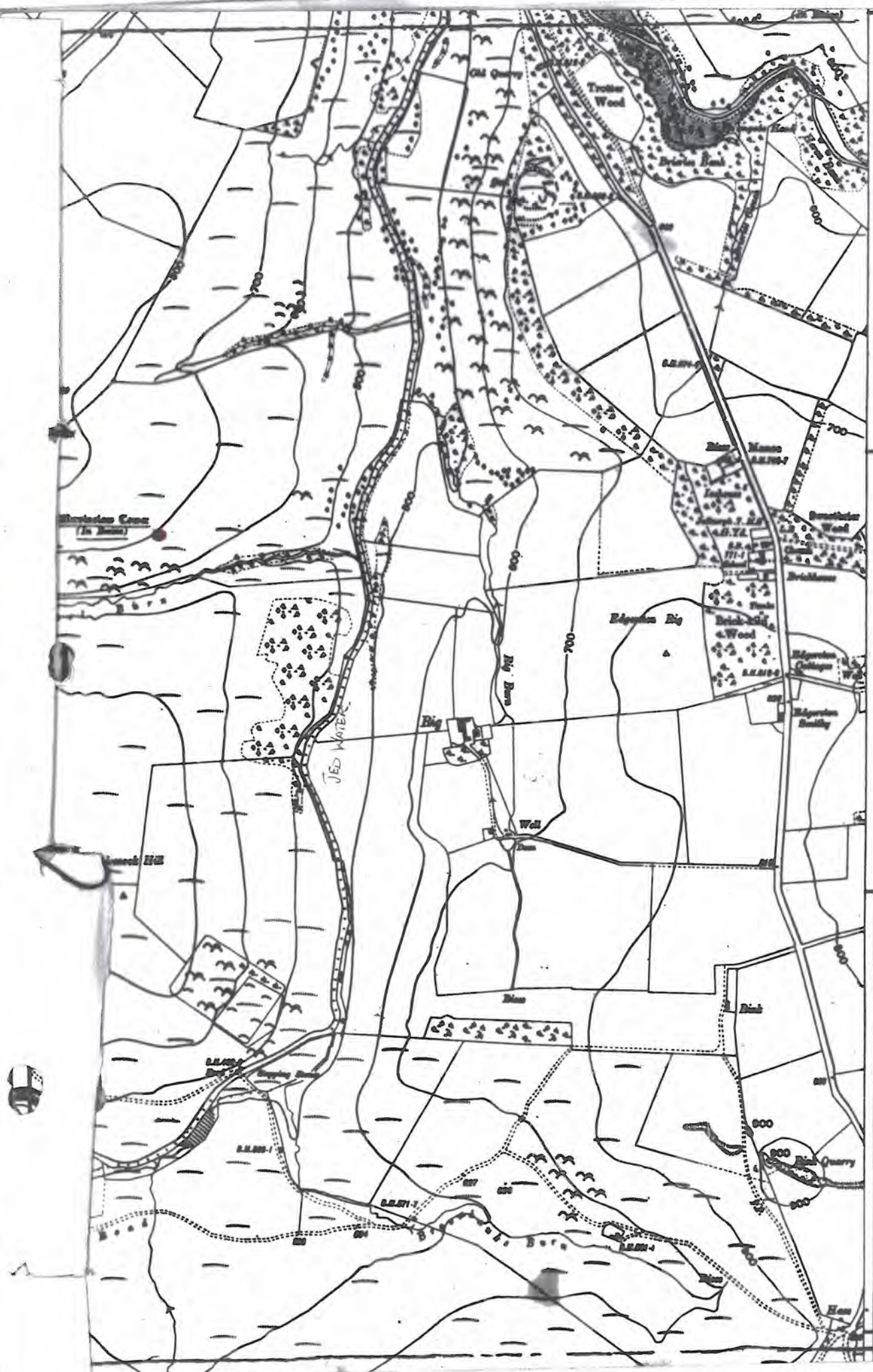
