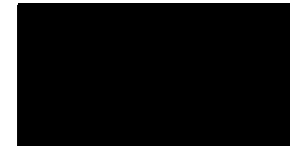

THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979
AMENDED ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The entry in the Schedule of monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the above Act in respect of the monument formally known as the Fort now to be known as Drummoral, fort, dated 29 December 1950 and recorded in the Division of the General Register of Sasines for the County of Wigtown on 26 January 1951 is hereby in accordance with the provisions of section 1(5) of the above Act amended to describe the area of the scheduled monument which is irregular, defined by the foot of the slope on the SE, SW and NW sides and on the NE by a line 30m beyond the outer ditch. This includes the fort, its outer defences and the outer slopes of the ridge on which it stands. The area, which has maximum dimensions of 100m ENE-WSW by 50m as shown delineated in red on the plan annexed and executed as relative hereto.

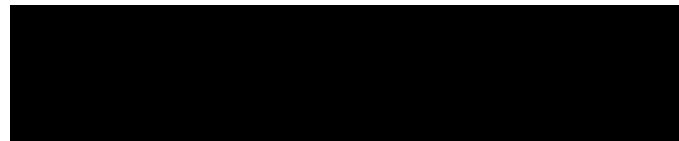

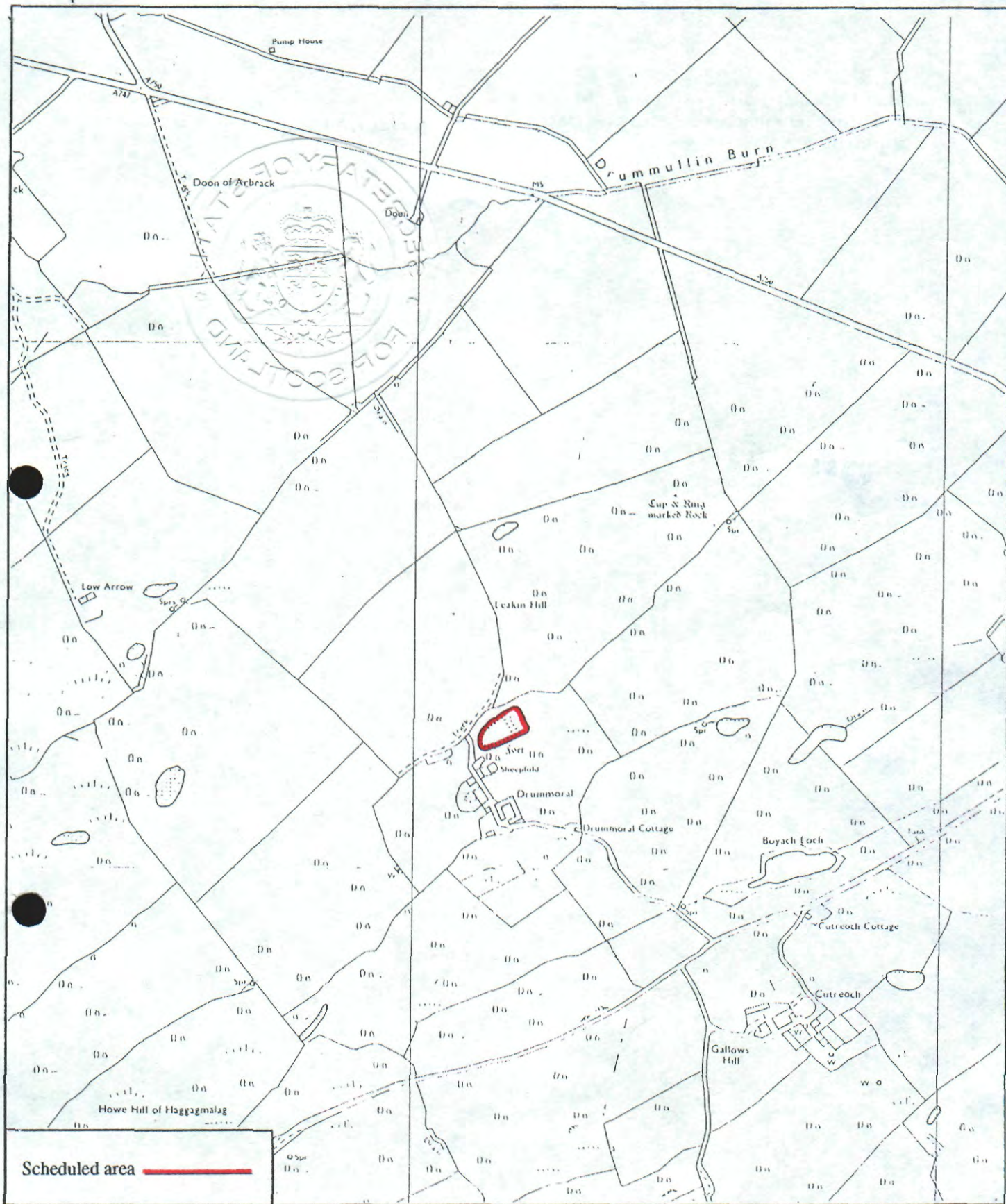

Whithorn Parish

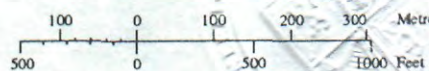
