The monument known as Doon Castle, broch, Ardwell comprises the remains of a broch, an Iron Age drystone fortification. The area to be scheduled consists of the entire promontory, down to high water mark of spring tides, and is irregular on plan, to include the broch, outwork, causeway and an area around in which evidence relating to their construction and use may survive. It measures a maximum of 95m N-S by 40m WSW-ENE. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Stoneykirk and the County of Wigtown as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

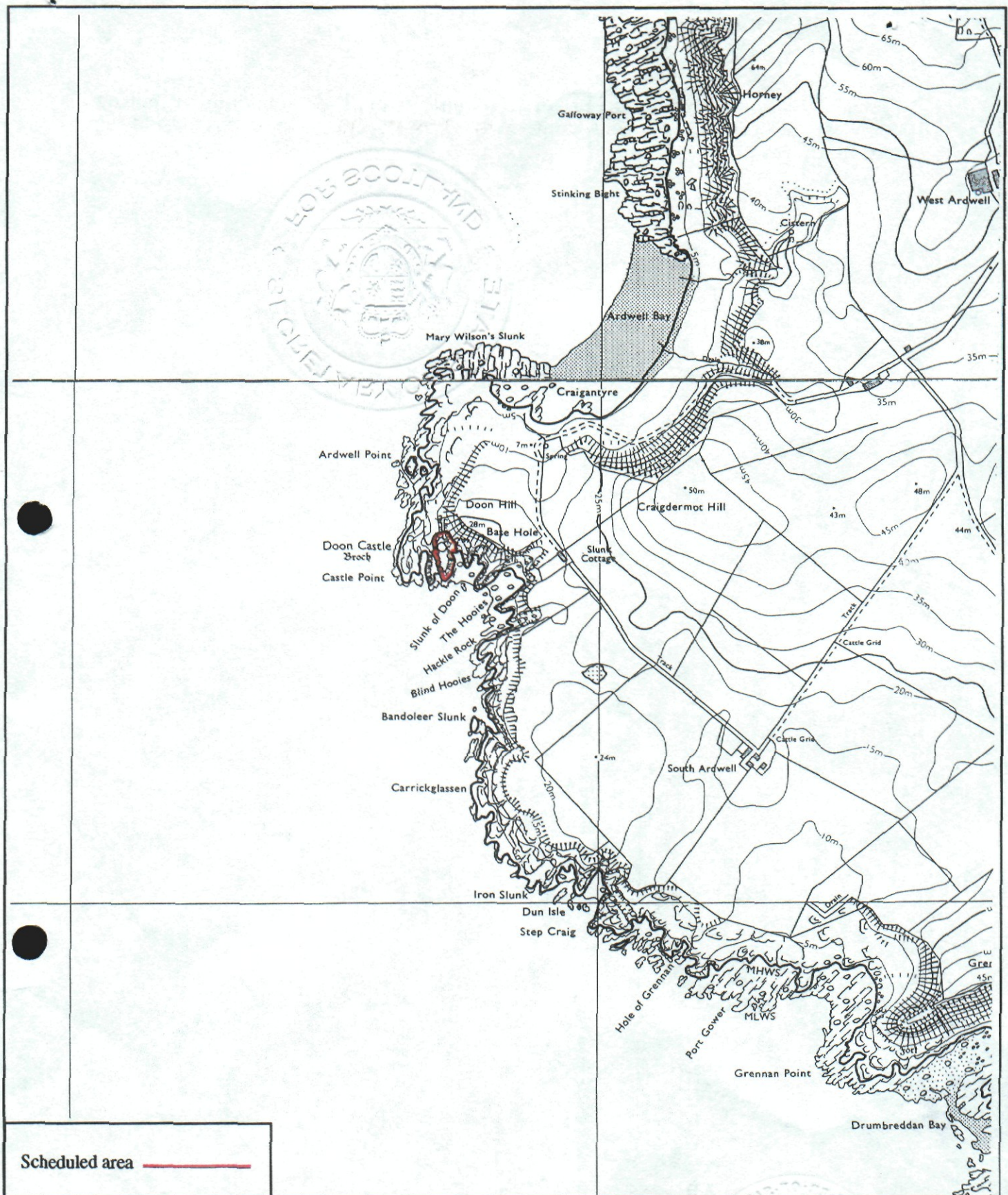
