ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as High Drummorie Mote, motte comprises a motte, a mound which was the site of an early timber castle. The area to be scheduled is defined to the SE by a burn and to the N and E by a field boundary. It is irregular on plan, measuring a maximum of 110m N-S by 95m E-W, to enclose the motte and outer enclosure and an area around them in which evidence relating to their construction and use may survive. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Kirkmaiden and the County of Wigtown as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

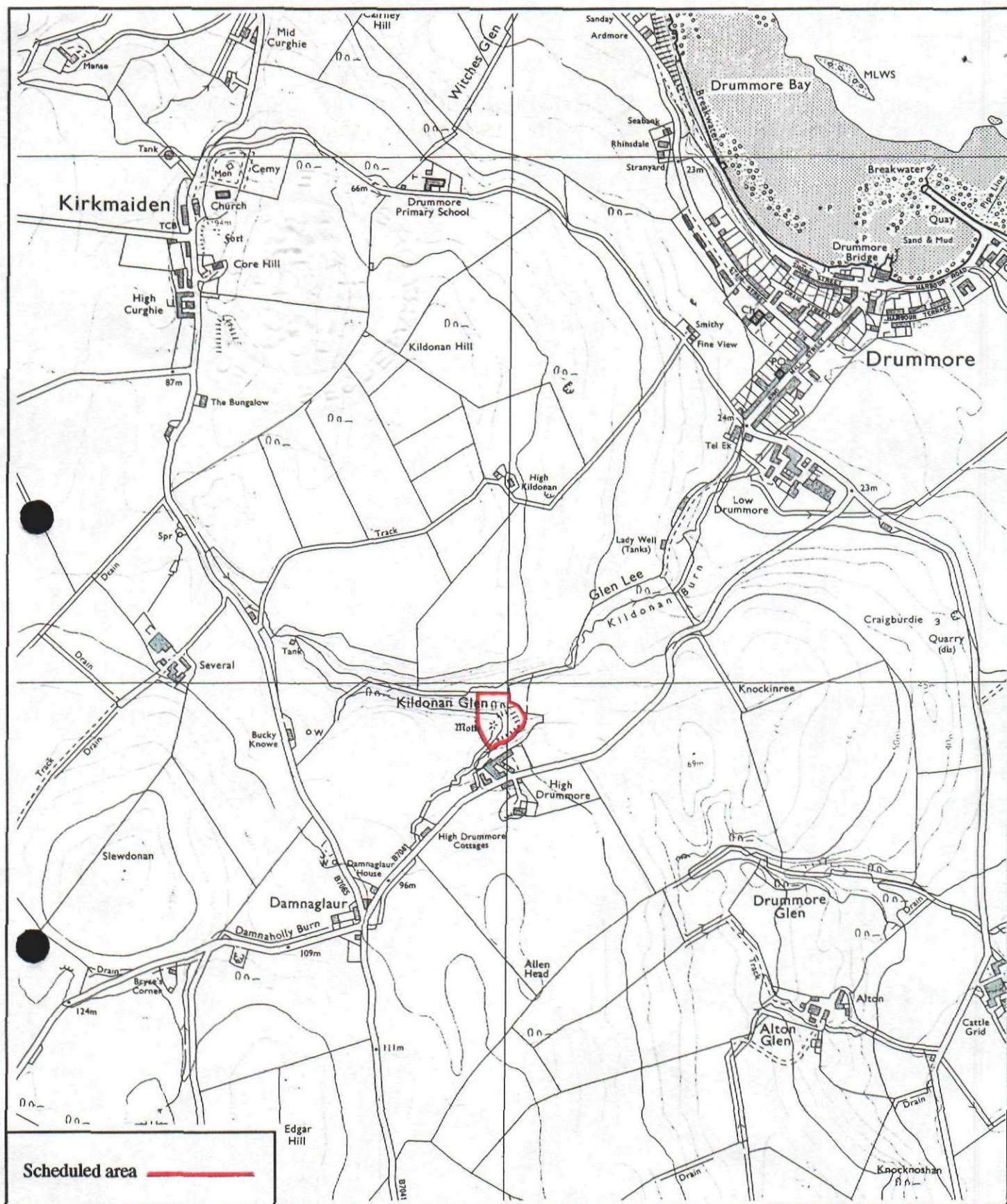

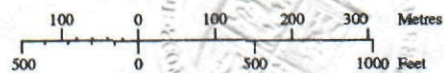
High Drummole Mote, motte
