The entry in the Schedule of monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under Section 1(1) of the above Act in respect of the monument known as Loch of Stourhoull, standing stones and cairn N of, dated 28 December 1953 and recorded in the Division of the General Register of Sasines for the County of Orkney and Zetland on 5 February 1954 is hereby in accordance with the provisions of section 1(5) of the above Act amended to describe the area of the scheduled monument as measuring 20m across for N stone circle, and 40m across for S stone circle and cairn as shown delineated in red on the plan annexed and executed as relative hereto.

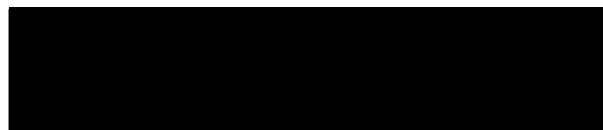

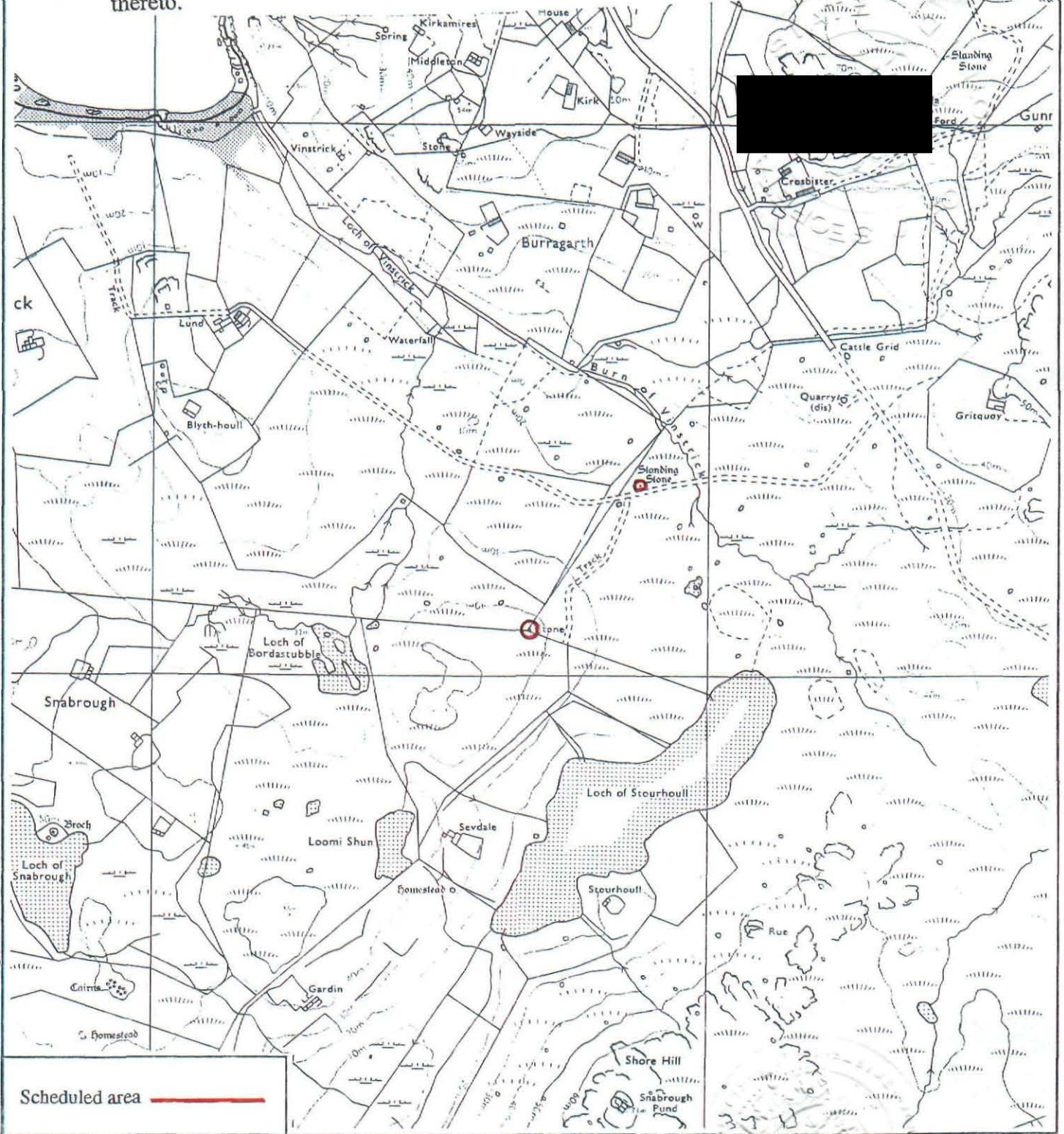

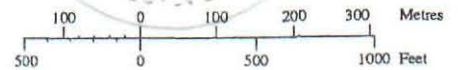
Loch of Stourhoul,
