ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Ettleton Cemetery, tombstones comprises a collection of medieval stonework set into or in front of a modern wall and surrounded by a metal railing. The area to be scheduled is bounded by the iron railing which forms an enclosure around the stones, and which is included in the scheduling. It measures approximately 3m by 6m. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Castleton and the County of Roxburgh as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto [REDACTED]

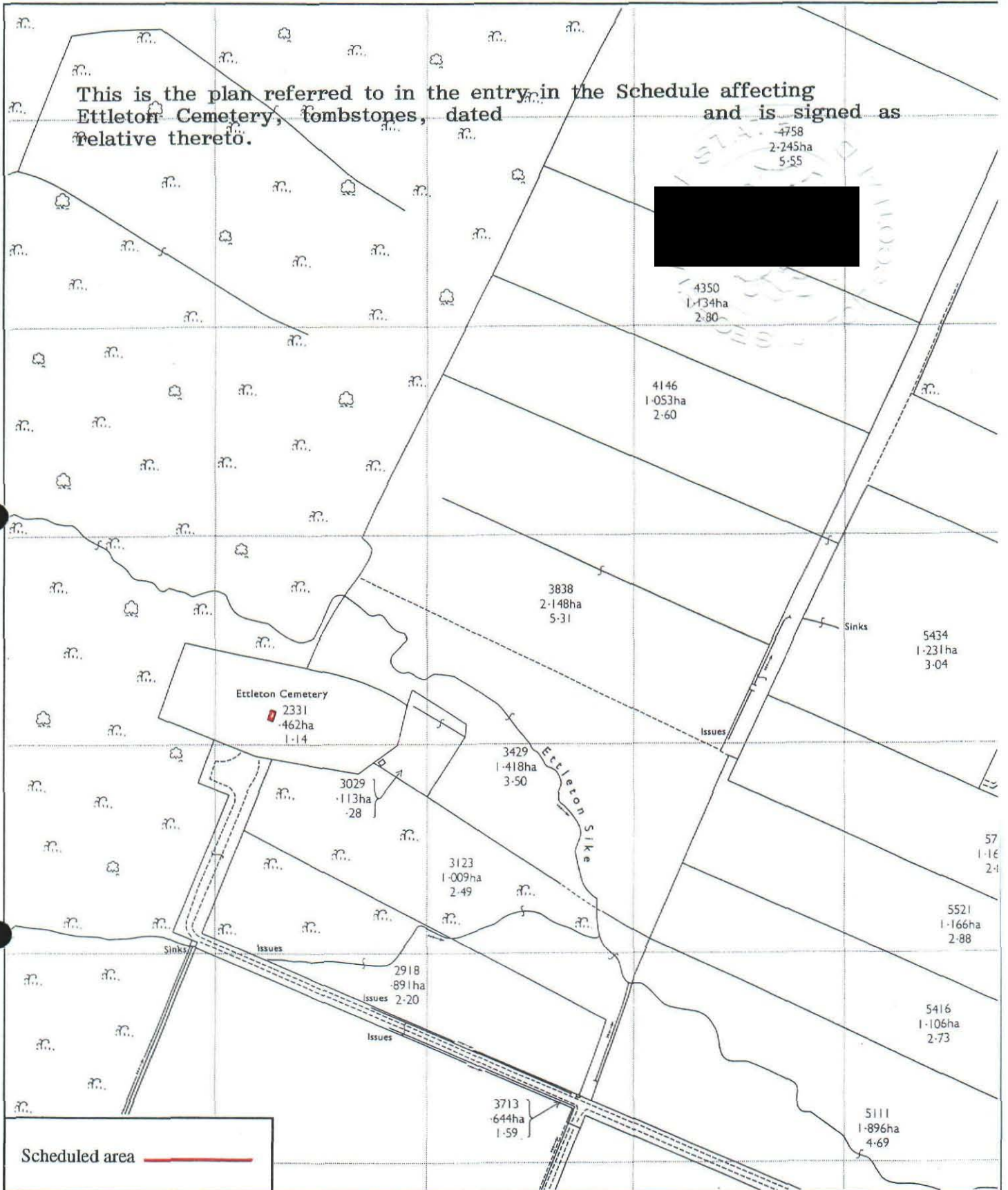

Scheduled area —

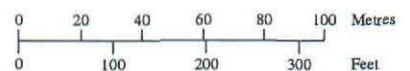
Ettleton Cemetery, tombstones
