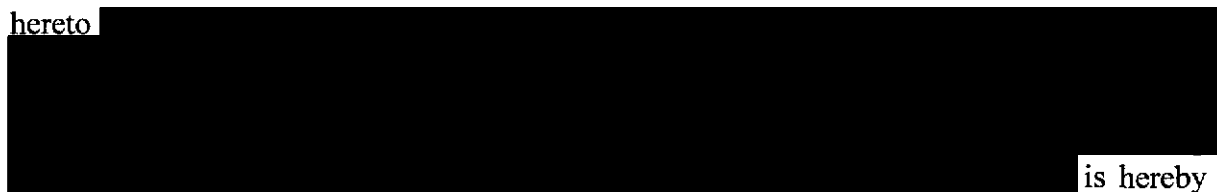

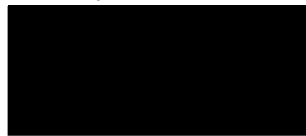

ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Bowden Hill, fort, Linlithgow comprises the remains of a hillfort of prehistoric date surviving as a series of earthworks. The area to be scheduled encompasses the visible features and an area around them in which traces of associated activity may be expected to survive. It is irregular in shape with maximum dimensions of 460m E-W by 150m. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Linlithgow and the County of West Lothian as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto



is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

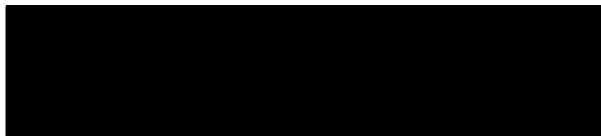

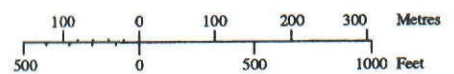
