

THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979 2306
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as **Cardean, Roman fort 230m NW of Cardean Mill** comprises the remains of a Roman fort with two probable annexes, visible as cropmarks captured on oblique aerial photographs. The fort dates to the late 1st century AD. The archaeological remains survive beneath the ploughsoil as buried features and deposits. The cropmarks identify all four sides of the fort, with two annexes to the SE and SW, and a Roman road entering the fort from the NE. The fort measures approximately 207m NW-SE by 179m transversely, enclosing an area of about 3.7ha. The fort is located on a promontory at the confluence of the River Isla and the Dean Water at 50m above sea level. The scheduled area is irregular on plan, to include the remains described above and an area around them within which evidence relating to the monument's construction, use and abandonment is expected to survive. The scheduled area specifically excludes the above-ground elements of all post-and-wire fences to allow for their maintenance. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Airlie and the County of Angus as shown in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto [REDACTED]

[REDACTED], is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

This entry supersedes the Entry in the Schedule of Monuments for the monument known then as **Cardean Roman Fort** as referred to in the Certificate of Service of Notice by the Minister of Public Building and Works in respect of the monument dated 21 May 1963 and recorded in the General Register of Sasines for the County of Angus on 28 June 1963.

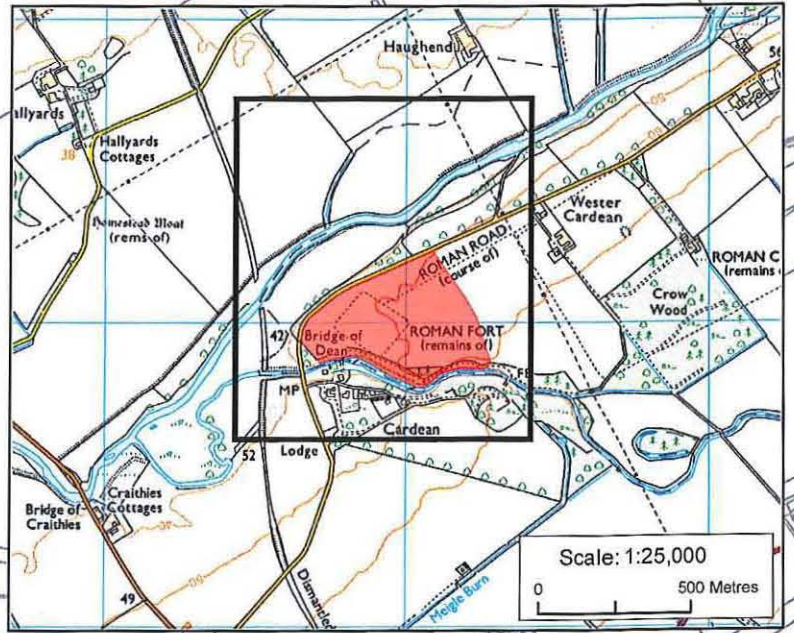
