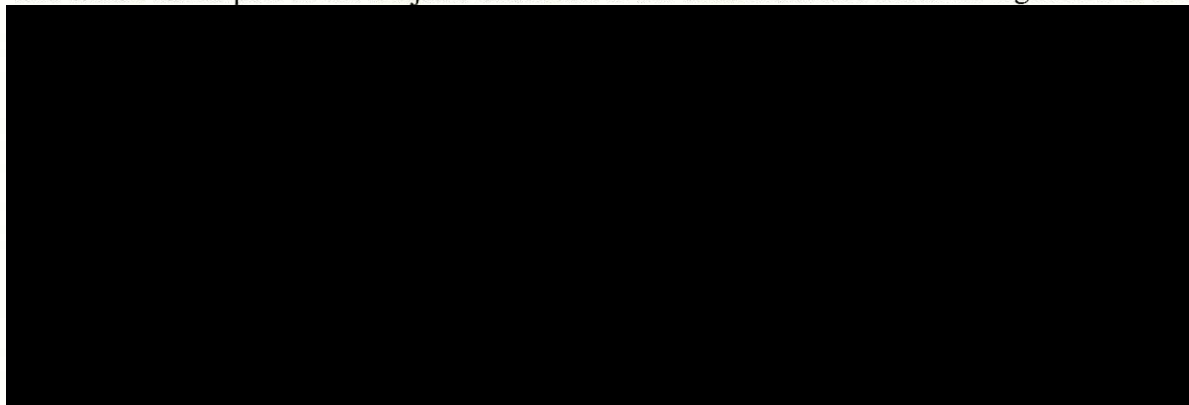


THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979 2308
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as **Battledykes, Roman camp** comprises the remains of a large Roman camp, possibly dating to the Severan campaign of AD 208-211, together with an enclosed prehistoric settlement and a souterrain which lie within the camp, and a ring-ditch (probably the remains of a prehistoric house) which lies immediately NW of the camp. These latter features are probably of Iron Age date (sometime between 500 BC and AD 500). The archaeological remains survive as buried features and deposits, represented by cropmarks visible on aerial photographs. The scheduled area is irregular on plan, to include the remains described above and an area around them within which evidence relating to the monument's construction, use and abandonment is expected to survive. The scheduled area specifically excludes the above-ground elements of all post-and-wire fences, hedges, drystone dykes and telegraph poles. The scheduled area also excludes the top 300mm of road surfaces and drains to allow for their upkeep and maintenance. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Oathlaw and the County of Angus as shown in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms part of the subjects described in the aftermentioned deeds or registered in the



is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

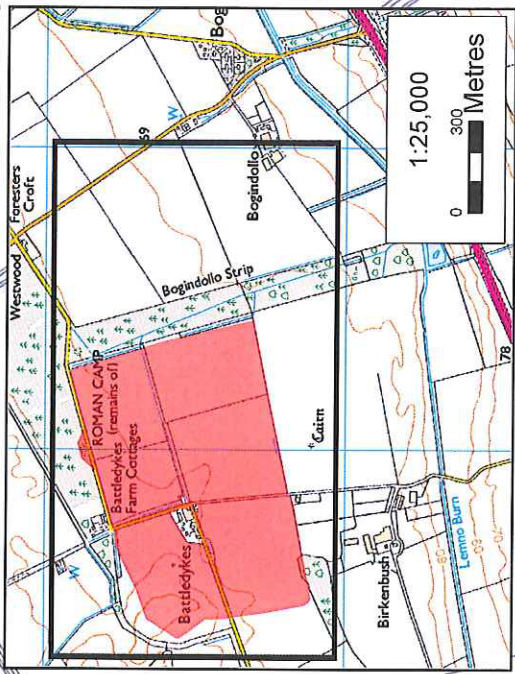
