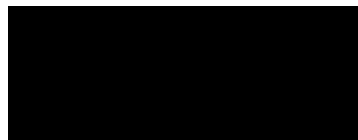

THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979  
AMENDED ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The entry in the Schedule of monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under Section 1(1) of the above Act in respect of the monument known as Knapperty Hill, long cairn, dated 18 February 1964 and recorded in the Division of the General Register of Sasines for the County of Aberdeen on 4 March 1964 is hereby in accordance with the provisions of section 1(5) of the above Act amended to describe the area of the scheduled monument as measuring a rectangular area 100m by 40m, the SE corner of which touches the present field boundary. It includes the cairn and an area around it within which traces of activity associated with its use may survive, as shown delineated in red on the plan annexed and executed as relative hereto.

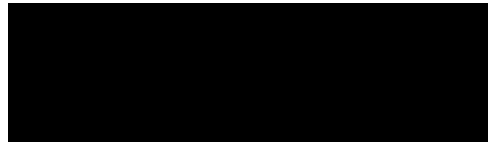

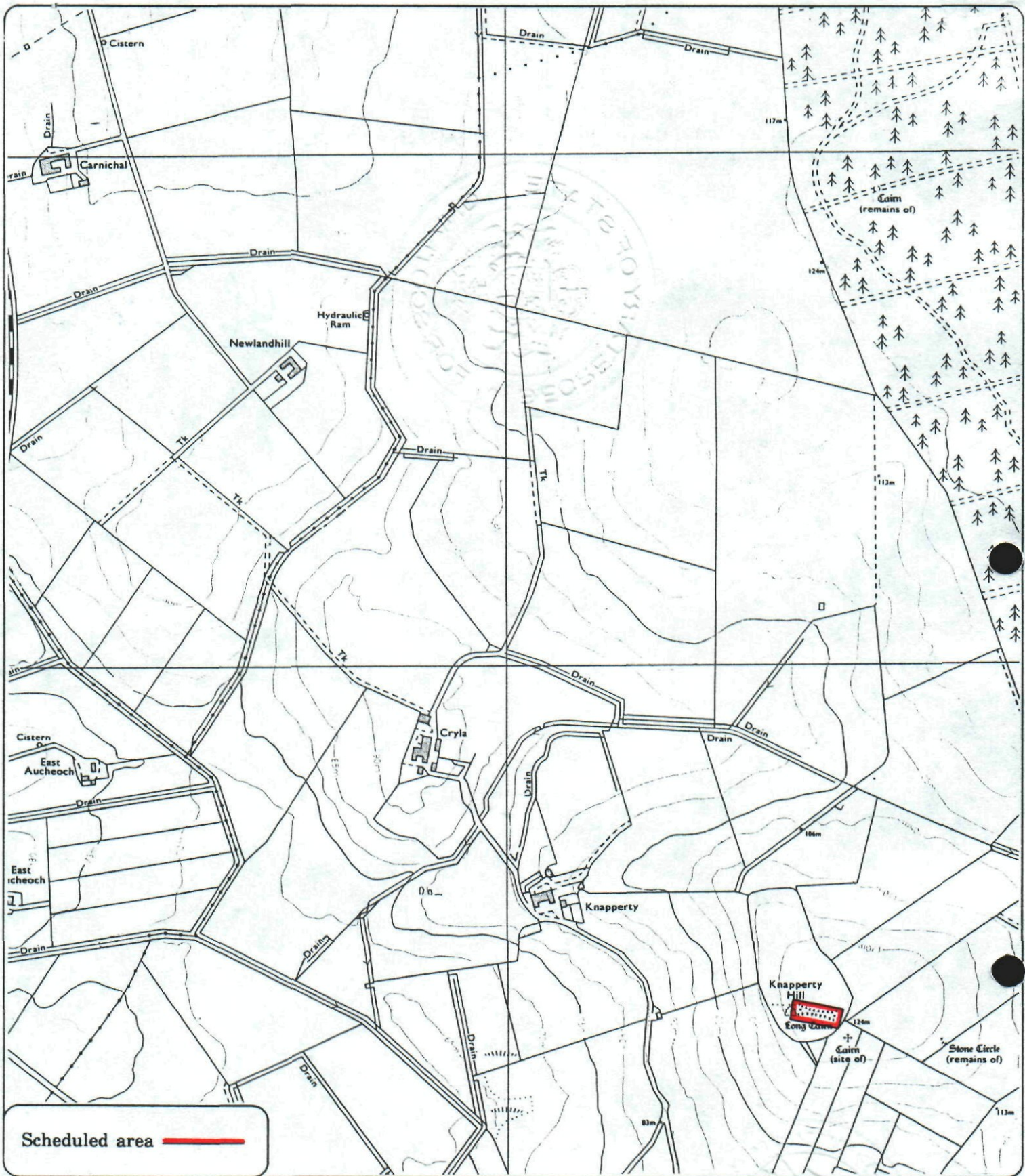

Scheduled area

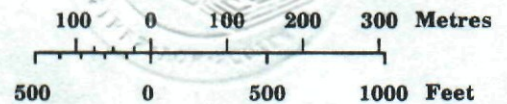
**Knapperty Hill, long cairn**
