ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Burgh of Rattray, St Mary's Chapel and Castle Hill, Old Rattray comprises the site of the deserted Burgh of Rattray, including the remains of the medieval chapel of St Mary and the site of the castle. The area to be scheduled is irregular on plan, with maximal dimensions of 690m SW-NE by 360m NW-SE. The scheduling is to exclude the eastern extension to the cemetery surrounding St Mary's chapel and the walls around it, and the farm buildings of Old Rattray farm and the walls surrounding them. The upper 30cm of the surface of the public road within the area is also excluded from scheduling. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Crimond and the County of Aberdeen as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms part of



is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section I(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

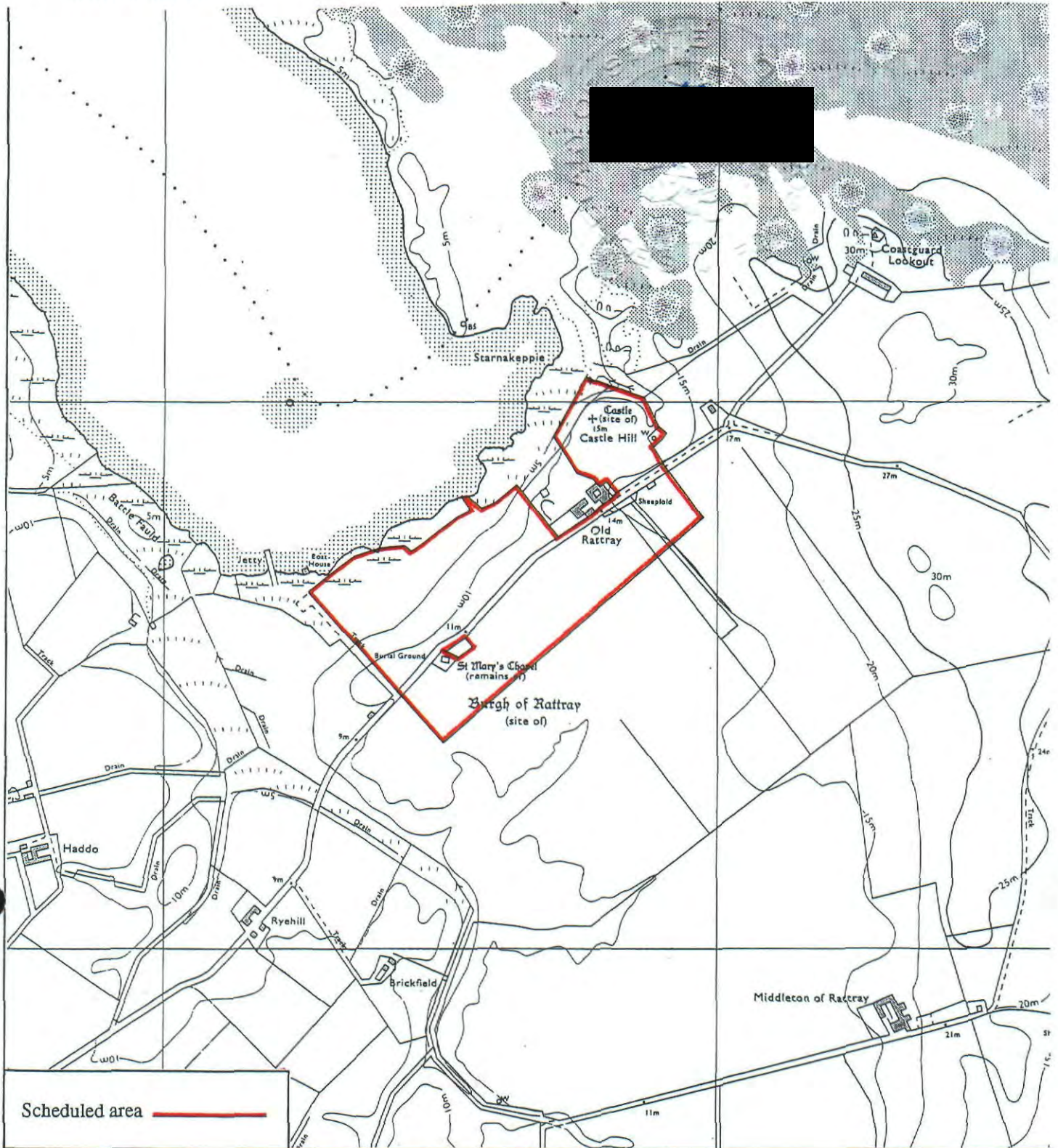
