The monument known as Westerton, standing stone 120m W of comprises a standing stone of the late Neolithic/earlier Bronze Age on which a human figure has been incised, lying 120m W of Westerton, the area to be scheduled measuring 5m in diameter centred on the stone. 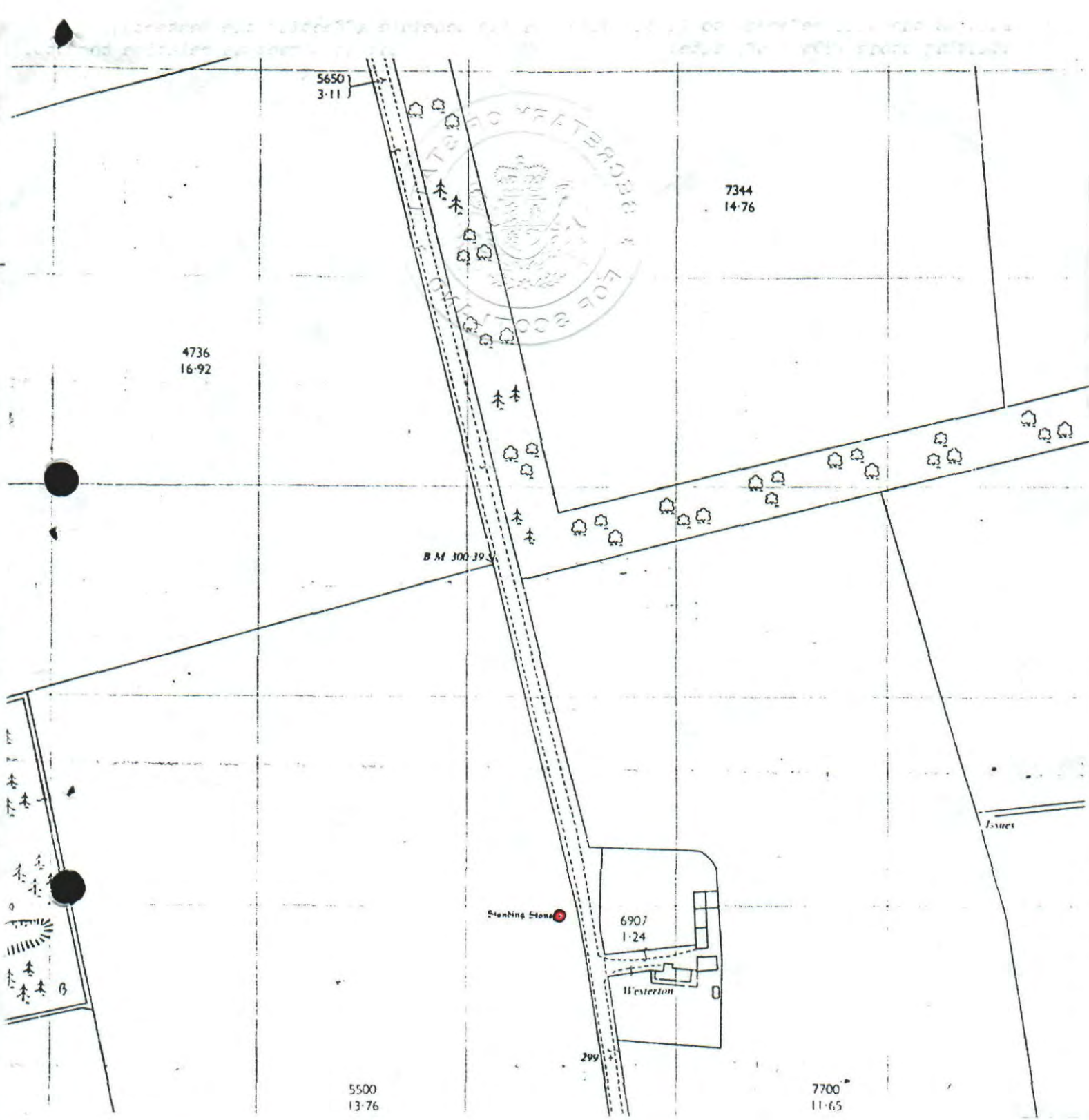

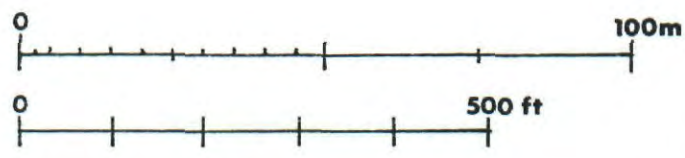
