ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Brough of Deerness, chapel and settlement, comprises a Viking and Late Norse settlement and associated chapel on the Brough of Deerness, a peninsula on the eastern extremity of Orkney mainland. The area to be scheduled is irregular. It has maximum dimensions of 240m from SW-NE, 145m E-W, and 185m N-S. The area is defined by the high water mark of ordinary spring tides as shown on the Ordnance Survey map, except in its SW corner where the former land bridge and a portion of the adjacent mainland, where associated archaeological remains may be expected to survive, are included. It extends west up to, but not including, the modern access path. The above-ground remains of information markers, interpretation panels, and hand rails are excluded from the scheduling, to allow for their maintenance. The monument, which lies in the Parish of St Andrews and Deerness and the County of Orkney and Zetland as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms part of the subjects

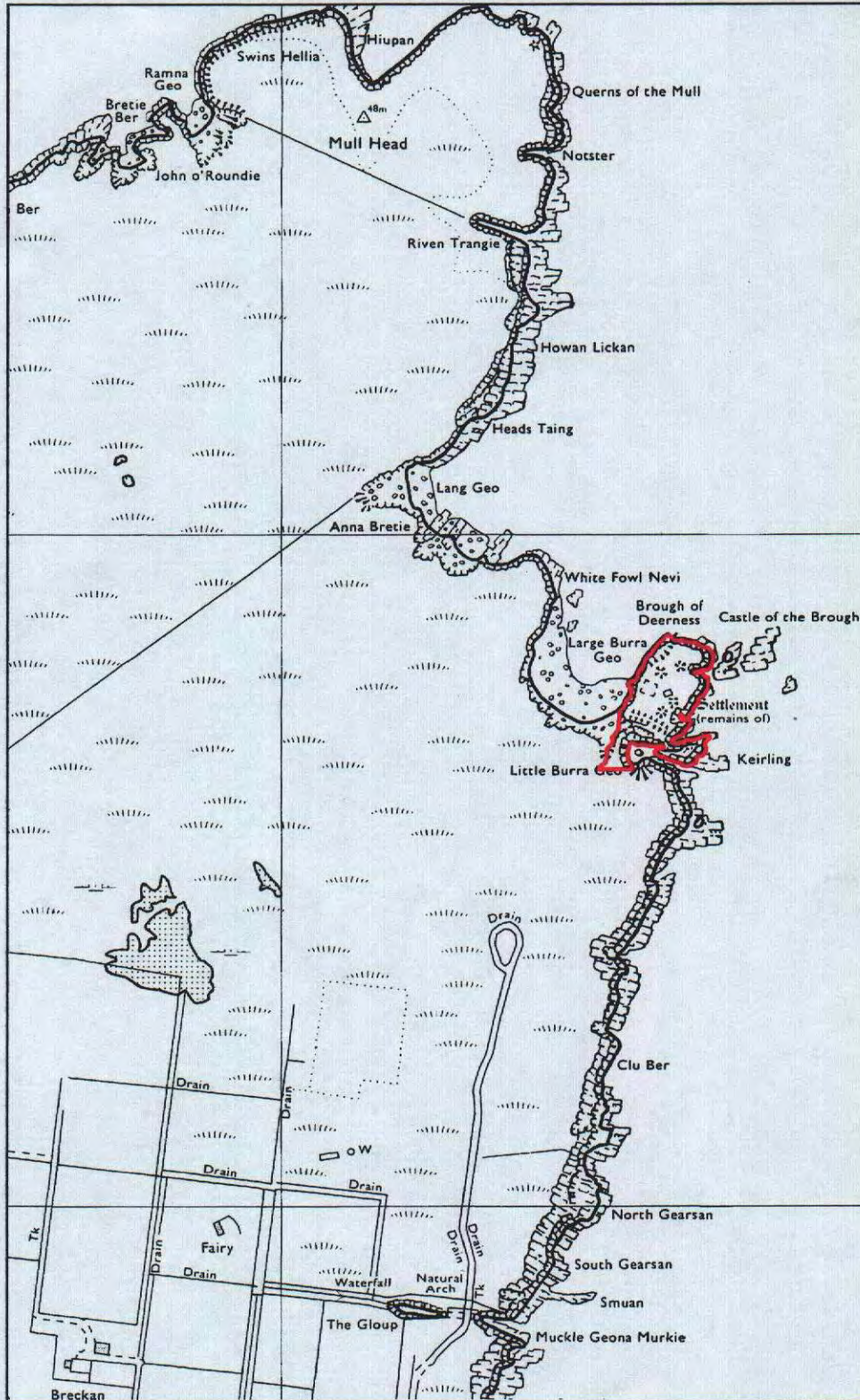
