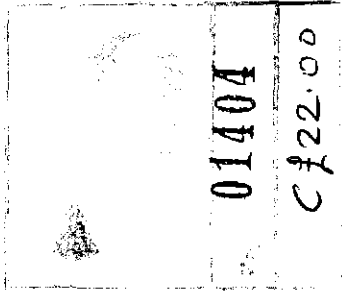

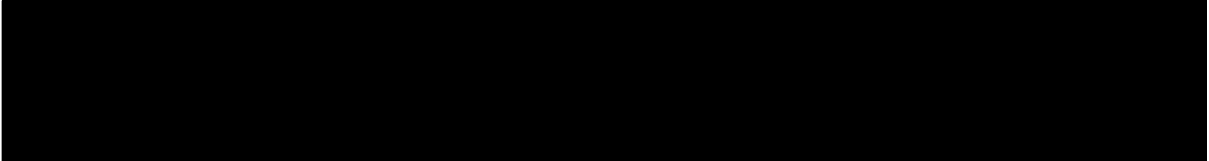

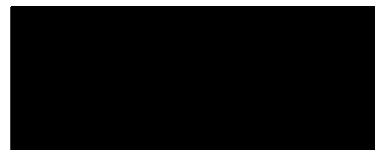
THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Cairnshee Wood, cairn 750m SSW of Cairnshee comprises a substantial burial cairn of the Early Bronze Age situated on the summit of Cairnshee. It measures 23m in diameter and 3.6m in height. It has been slightly disturbed by the construction of small shelters from the stones but the burial deposits beneath the cairn will not have been disturbed. An area measuring 40m in diameter, centred on the cairn, is proposed for scheduling. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Durris and the County of Kincardine as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms part



, is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

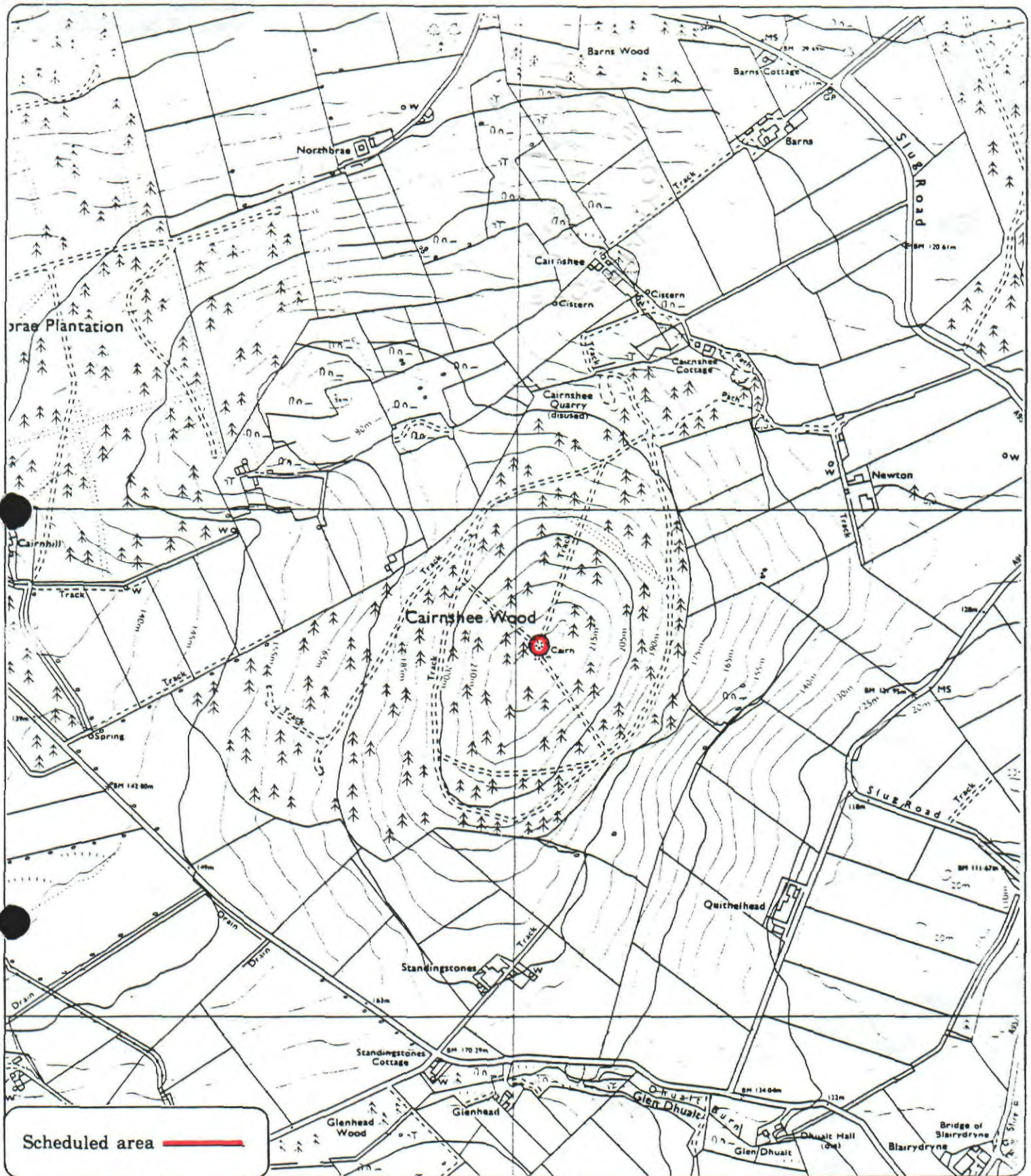

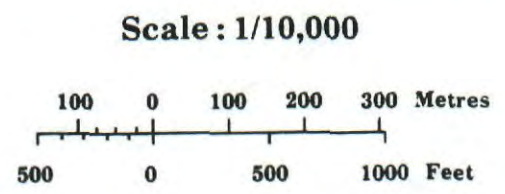
