ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Dun Buidhe, broch, Eochar comprises of an Iron Age drystone fortification, a broch, standing upon a slight knoll in a marsh. The remains take the form of a mound, within which can be observed stones marking the outer face of a circular wall 4m thick and 18m in overall diameter. The entrance, over which at least one lintel survives in situ, is on the NE side. The area to be scheduled is circular, 25m in diameter and centred upon the broch. The monument, which lies in the Parish of South Uist and the County of Inverness as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

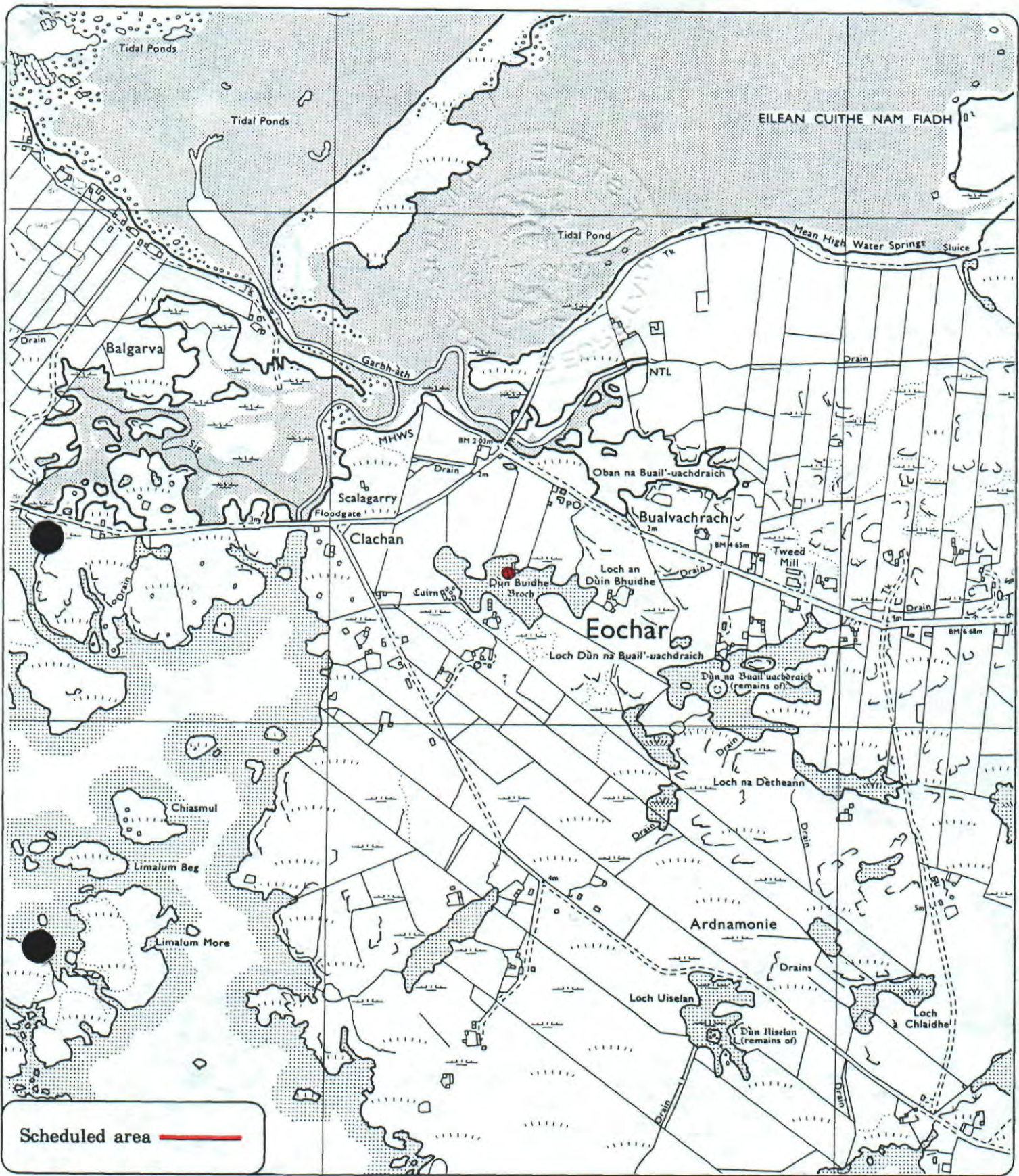
