



THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979  
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Dun Uiselan, dun and causeway comprises a small dun, probably of Iron Age date, upon an island (which may be artificial) in Loch Uiselan. It is linked to the SE shore of the loch by a causeway. The dun is approximately 20m ENE-WSW by 16m transversely, and a possible entrance can be seen in the SE, where a partially submerged curving boulder causeway, 2m in width and 60m in overall length, gives access through the shallow loch from the shore. The interior of the dun is obscured by the remains of a small rectangular structure of later date. The area to be scheduled is irregular, 35m E-W by 30m N-S to contain the entire surface area of the island on which the dun is sited plus an additional strip 20m wide and 60m long attached to its SE corner and centred upon the causeway. The monument, which lies in the Parish of South Uist and the County of Inverness as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms part of the

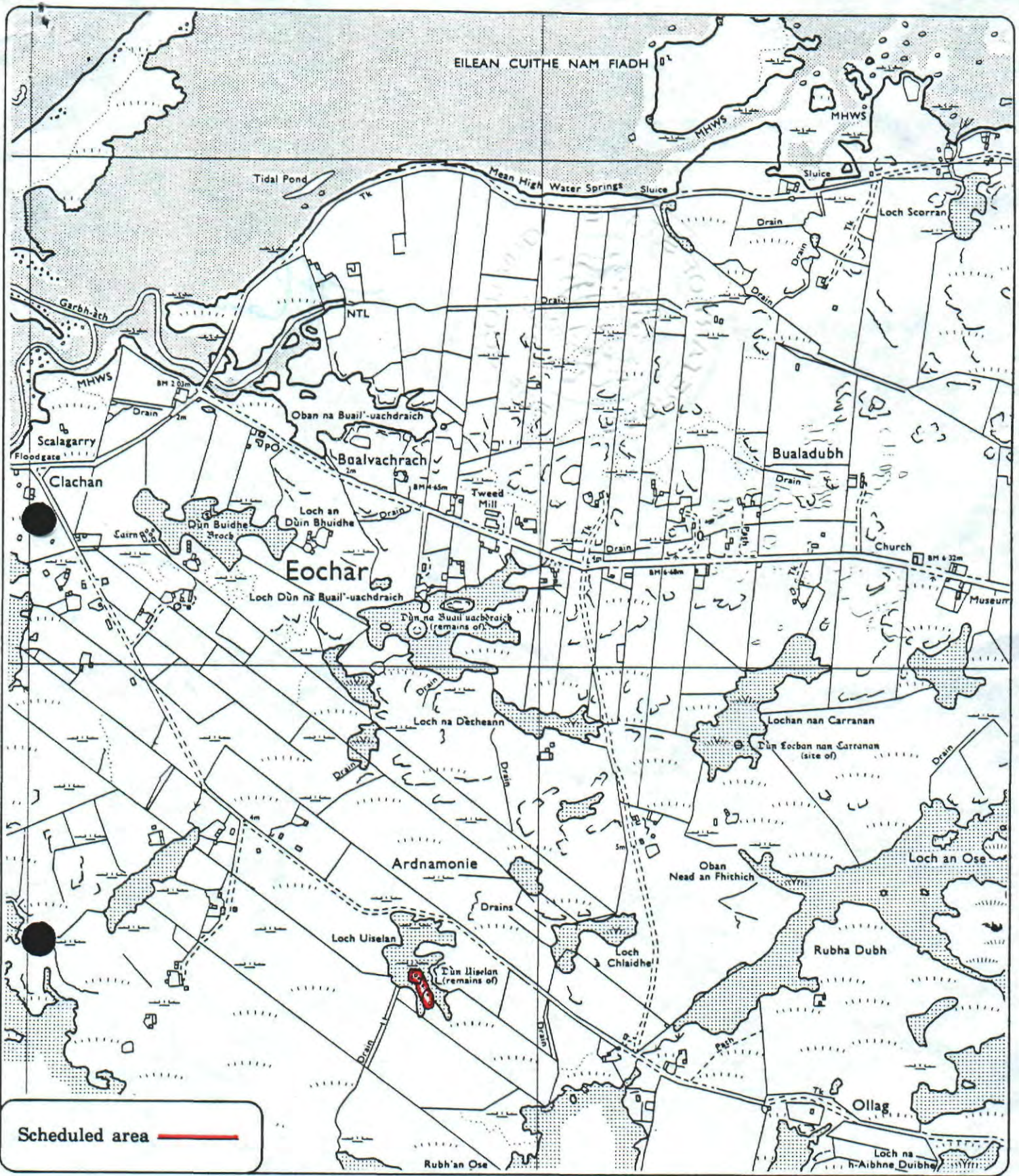

Scheduled area —

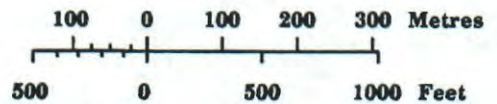
**Dun Uiselan, dun and causeway**
