The monument known as Sideval, stone circle 400m S of comprises of a stone circle of Late Neolithic to Early Bronze Age date, situated at the head of Loch Seaforth. It is sometimes referred to as "Fangs". The area to be scheduled is circular, measuring a maximum of 40m in diameter to be centred on the stone circle. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Lochs and the County of Ross and Cromarty as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms part

hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.
