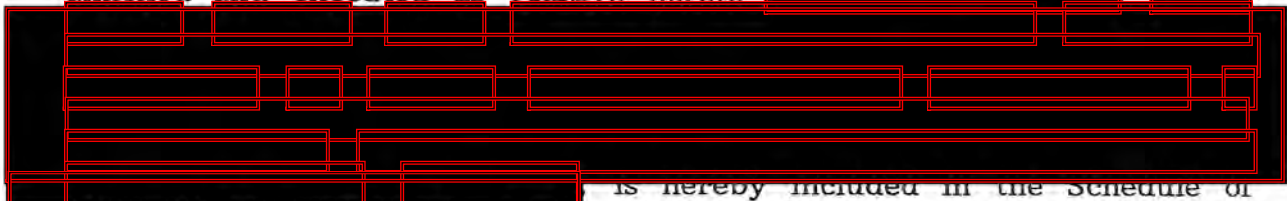

ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Dun Mara, dun comprises of the remains of a fortified promontory of Iron Age date known as Dun Mara. The area to be scheduled is irregular and measures a maximum of 100m NW-SE by 70m E-W to be centred on the dun and including an area of surrounding land which may contain evidence of activity associated with its construction and use. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Barvas and the County of Ross and Cromarty as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto [redacted]
