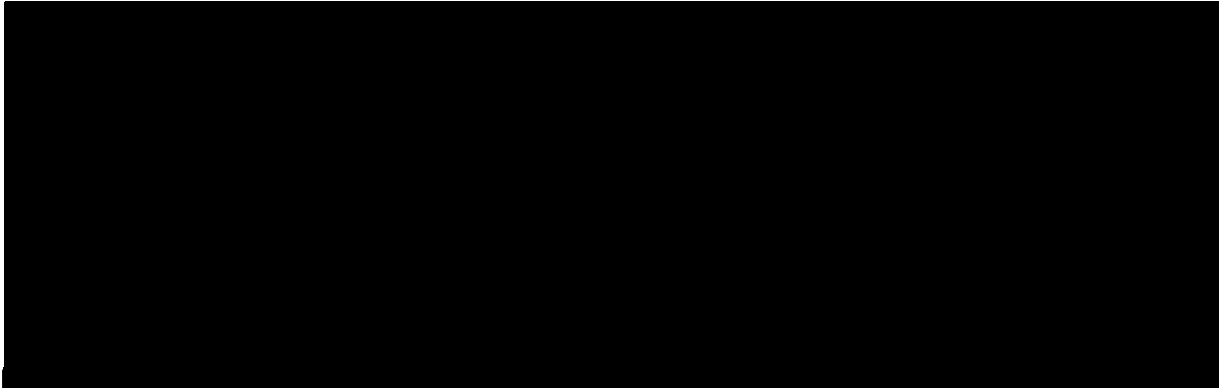

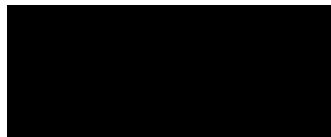
THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Bunavoneadar, whaling station, Harris comprises the remains of a whaling station dating from approximately AD 1900 and abandoned around 1939, and represents much the best preserved such establishment in Scotland. The area to be scheduled is irregular in plan, bounded to the E by the public road, but excluding a house in use, and its immediate grounds. The area is extended W into the sea-loch to include the foundations of the vanished pier and jetty. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Harris and the County of Inverness as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and



, is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

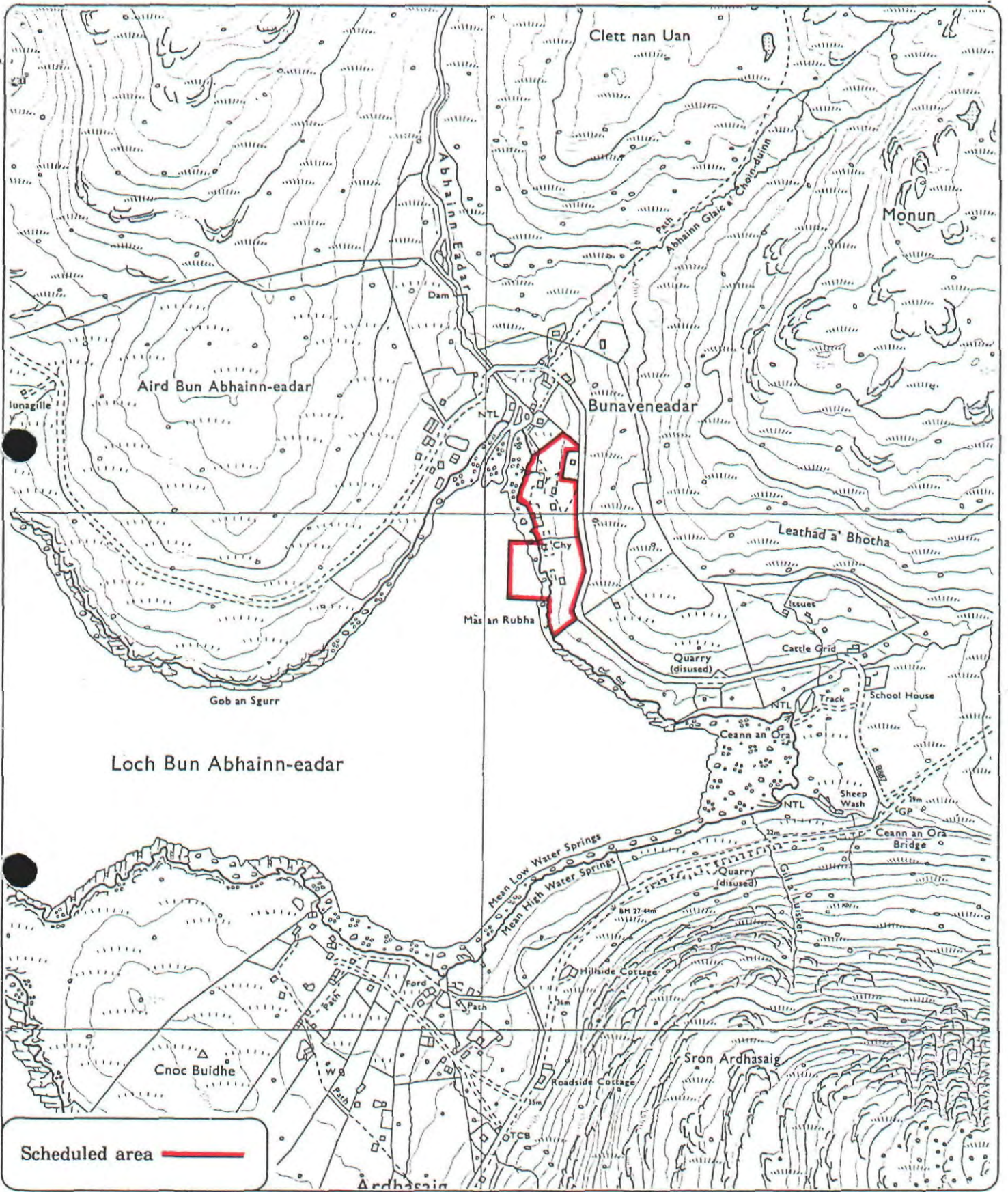

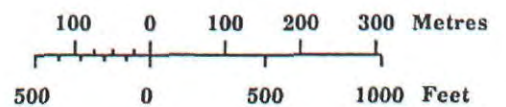
