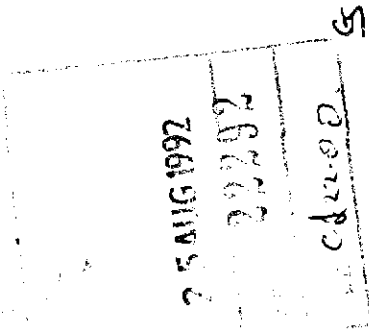

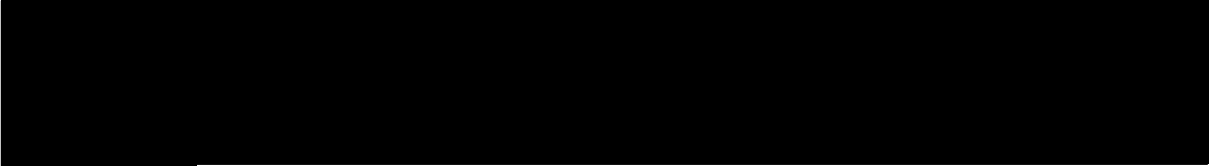

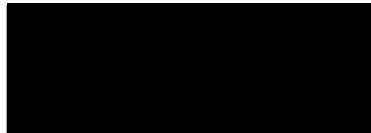
THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Kingencleugh Castle comprises the remains of a fortified residence which dates from the sixteenth century. The area to be scheduled is square with sides measuring a maximum of 20m to be centred on the castle, but excluding the fence to the NW. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Mauchline and the County of Ayr as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms part of the subjects described in the Disposition



is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

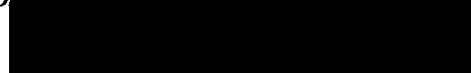

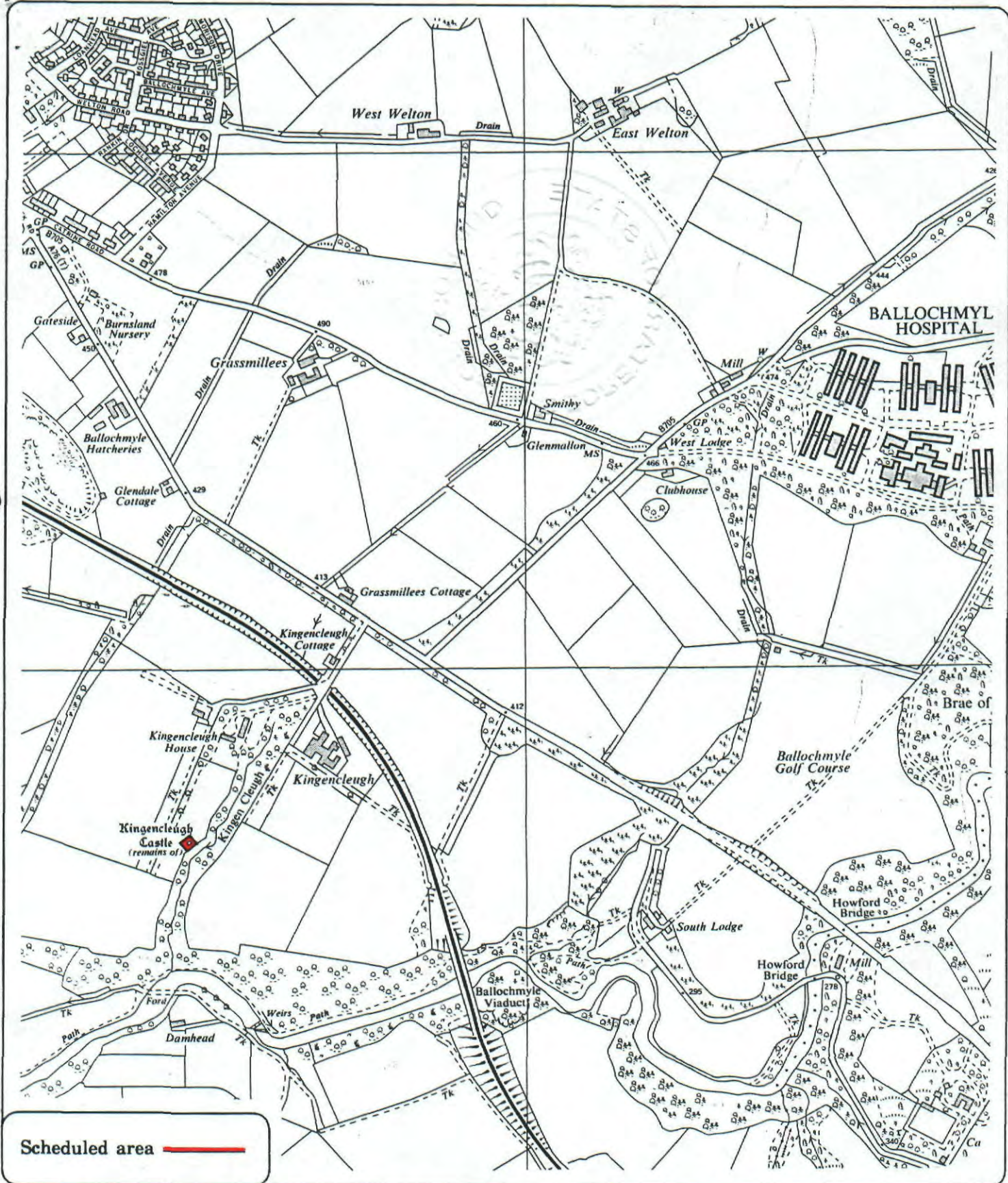
