ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Arkendeith Tower comprises the remains of a small 16th/17th century defensive tower house known as Arkendeith Tower. The area to be scheduled is rectangular and extends 2m from the exterior walls of the building, measuring a maximum of 10m N-S by 9.5m E-W. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Avoch and the County of Ross and Cromarty as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms part of the subjects



included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

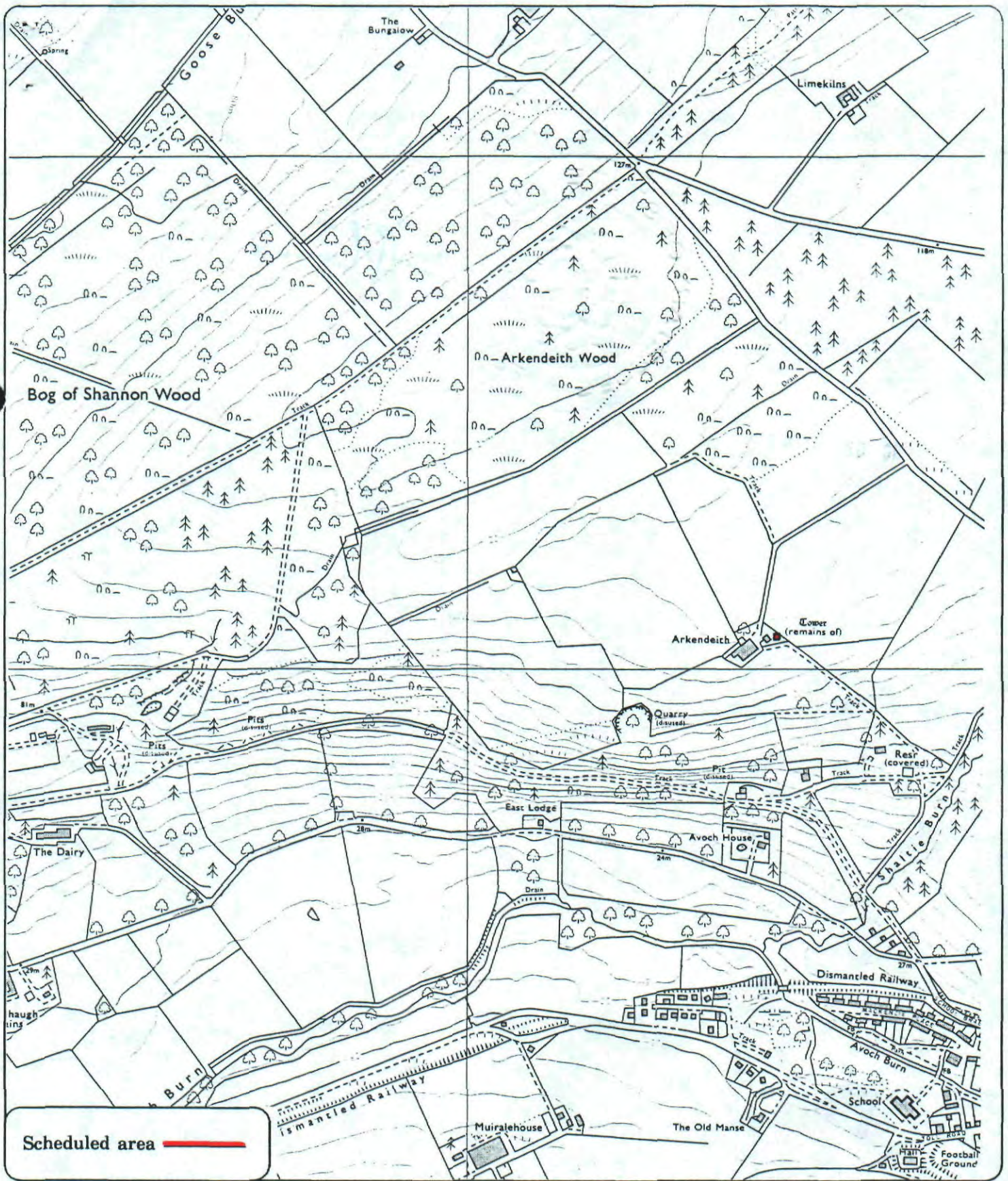

Scheduled area

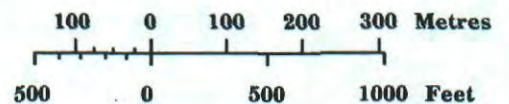
Arkendeith Tower
