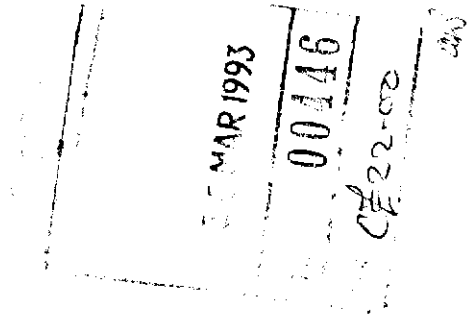

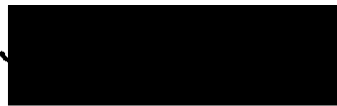

THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as St Trothan's Church comprises the remains of the former Odrig parish church and is situated in an old graveyard. Two corner skew-putts, dated 1633 and 1743 may indicate the dates of construction and subsequent repair. The area to be scheduled is rectangular and extends a maximum of 2m from the exterior walls of the chapel measuring a maximum of 20.6m E-W by 10.6m N-S. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Odrig and the County of Caithness as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto, is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

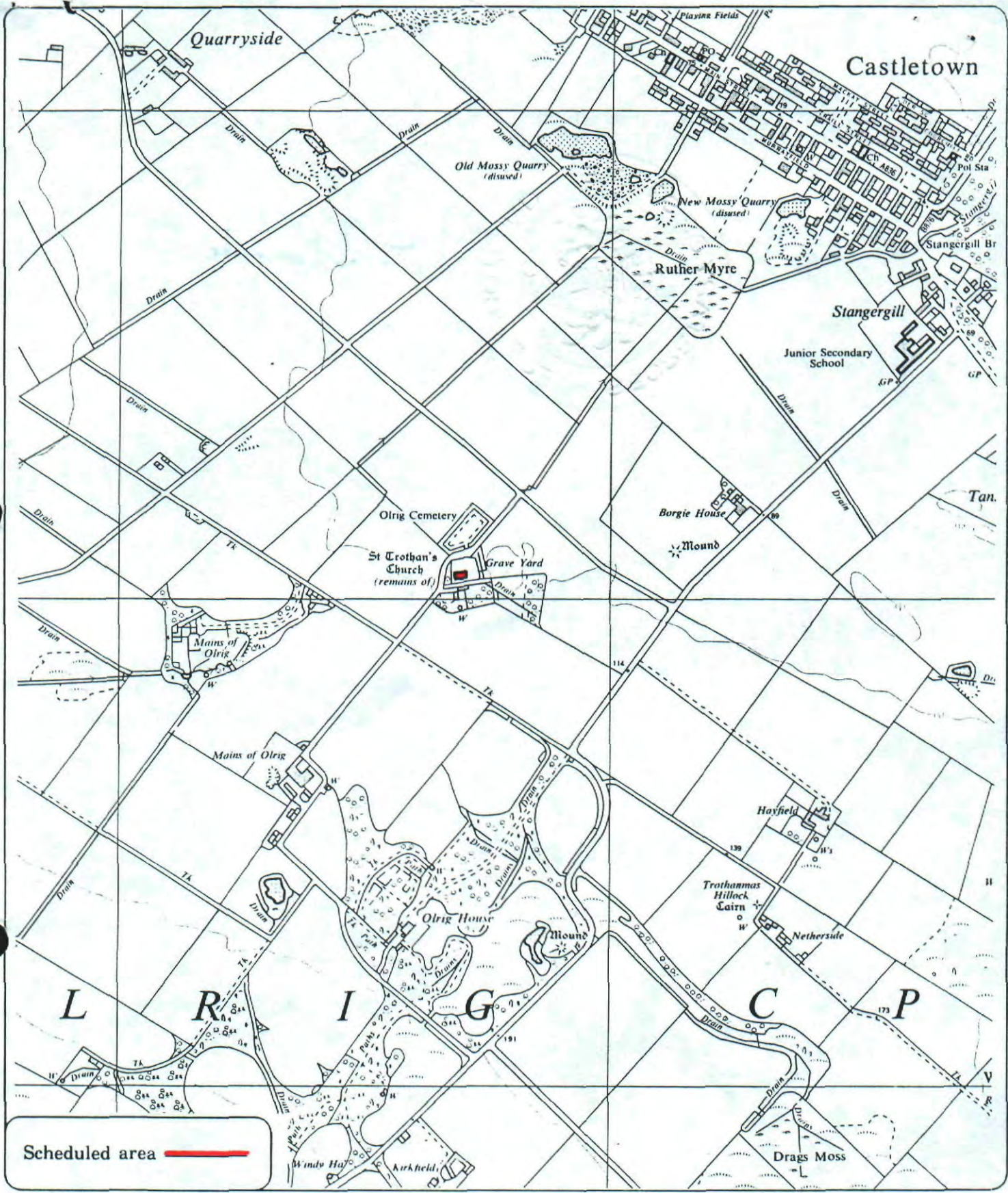
