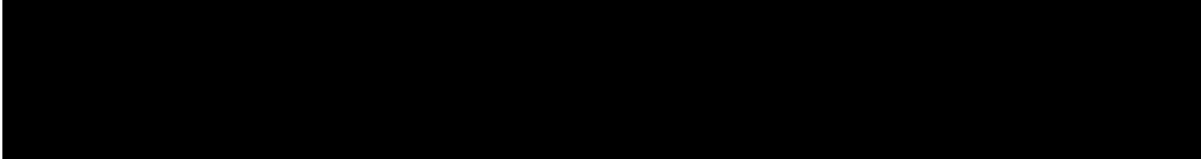

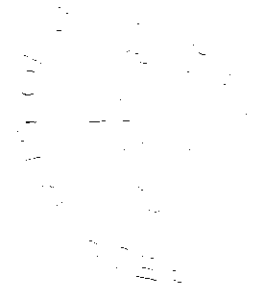

ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Hirendeane Castle comprises the remains of Hirendeane Castle, a small keep of sixteenth century date. The area to be scheduled is irregular, measuring a maximum of 130m E-W by 90m N-S, to include the castle and an area where further related features are likely to survive. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Temple and the County of Midlothian as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms part of the subjects described in the Disposition by Albert Edward Harry Mayer Archibald,



is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

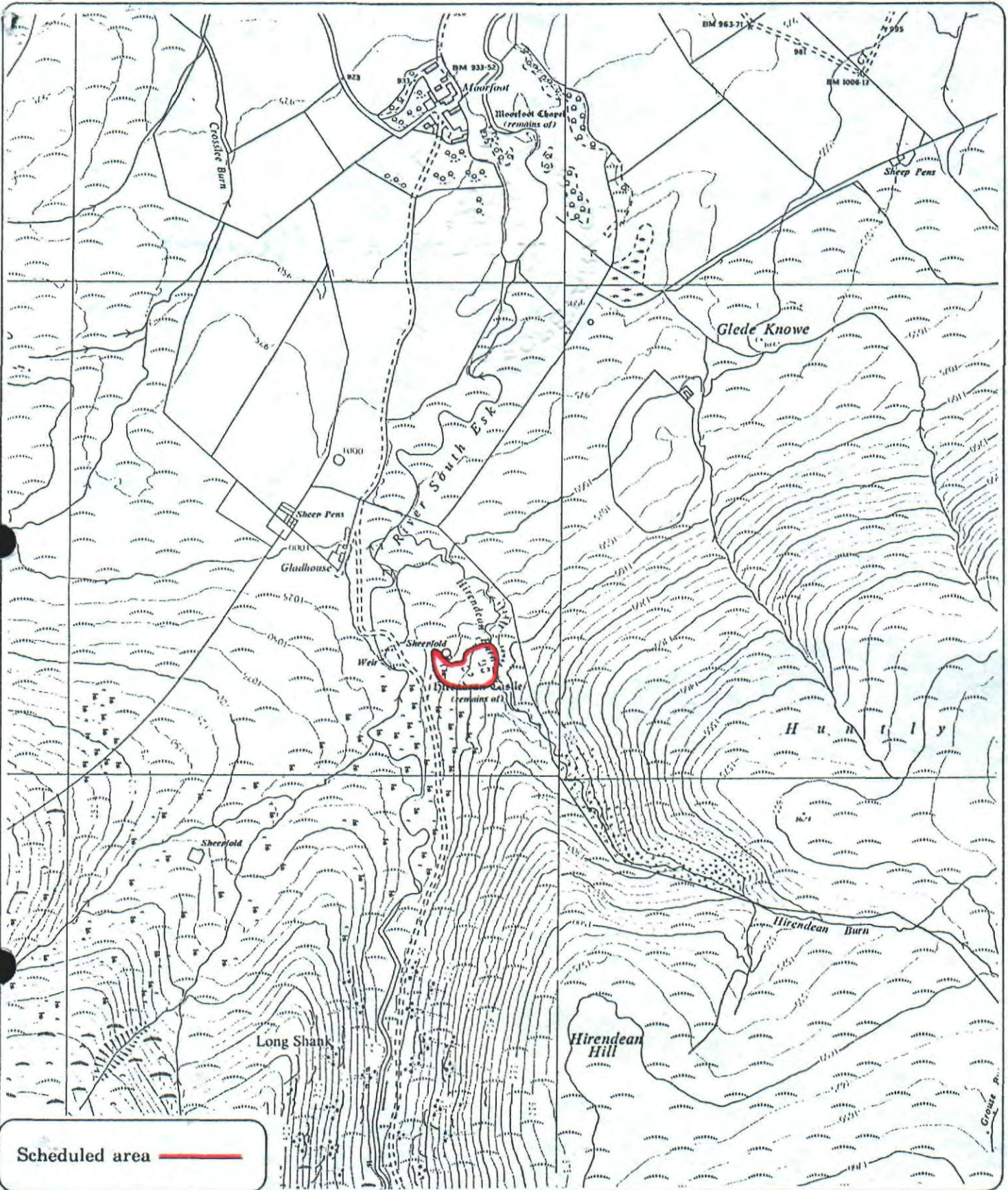

Scheduled area

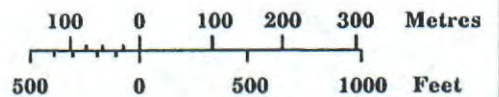
Hiredean Castle
