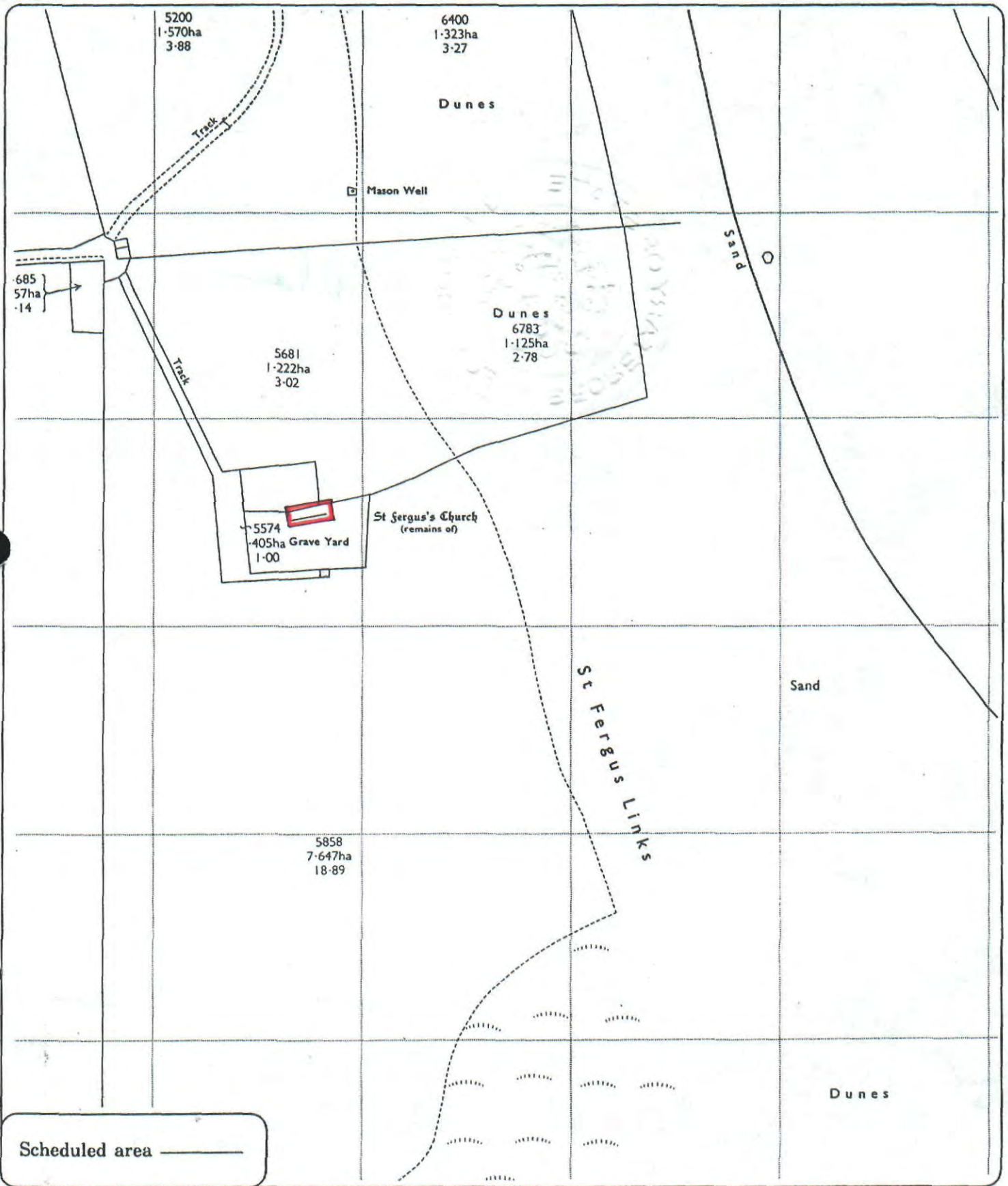
The monument known as St Fergus's Church, old parish church comprises the remains of a mediaeval church dedicated to St Fergus, originally the parish church of Inverugie. The area to be scheduled is rectangular, extending 2m from the exterior walls of the church and measuring a maximum of 23.5m by 10.7m. The monument, which lies in the Parish of St Fergus and the County of Banff as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto, is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.



Scheduled area ———
