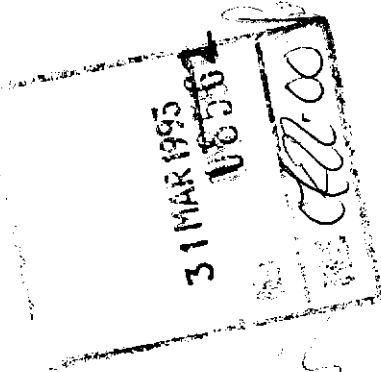

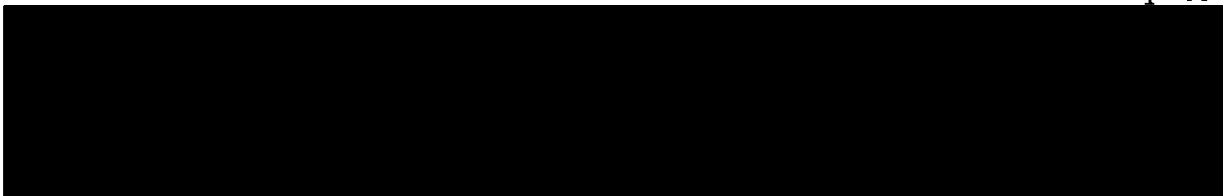

THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979  
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Colquhonnies Castle comprises the remains of a sixteenth century towerhouse thought to have been built by Forbes of Towie and known as Colquhonnies Castle. The area to be scheduled is rectilinear, measuring a maximum of 17.9m E-W by 16m N-S, but excluding the modern wooden buildings. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Strathdon and the County of Aberdeen as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms part



is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

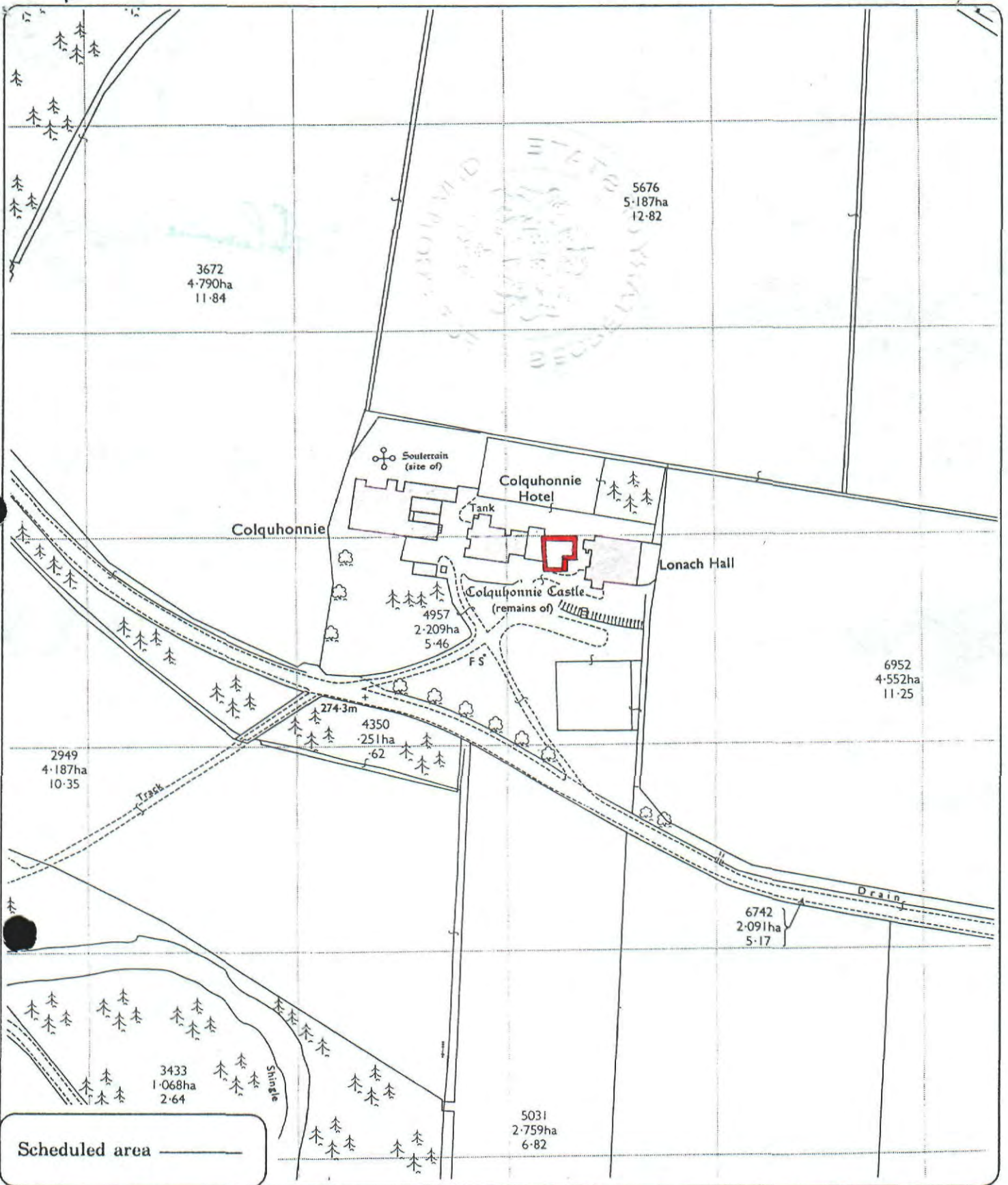
