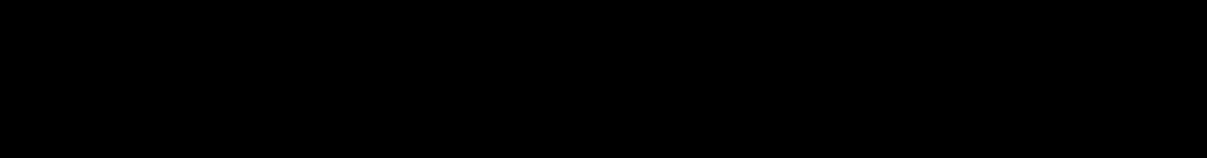

THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Eden Castle comprises the remains of a sixteenth/seventeenth century towerhouse, known as Eden Castle. The area to be scheduled is rectilinear, extending 3m from the exterior walls of the castle, measuring a maximum of 18m N-S by 18m E-W to include the ground plan of the castle, but excluding the concrete farm enclosures, gates and dykes abutting against the N, S and E castle walls, and excluding the road on the W boundary. The monument, which lies in the Parish of King Edward and the County of Aberdeen as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms



is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

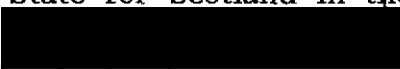

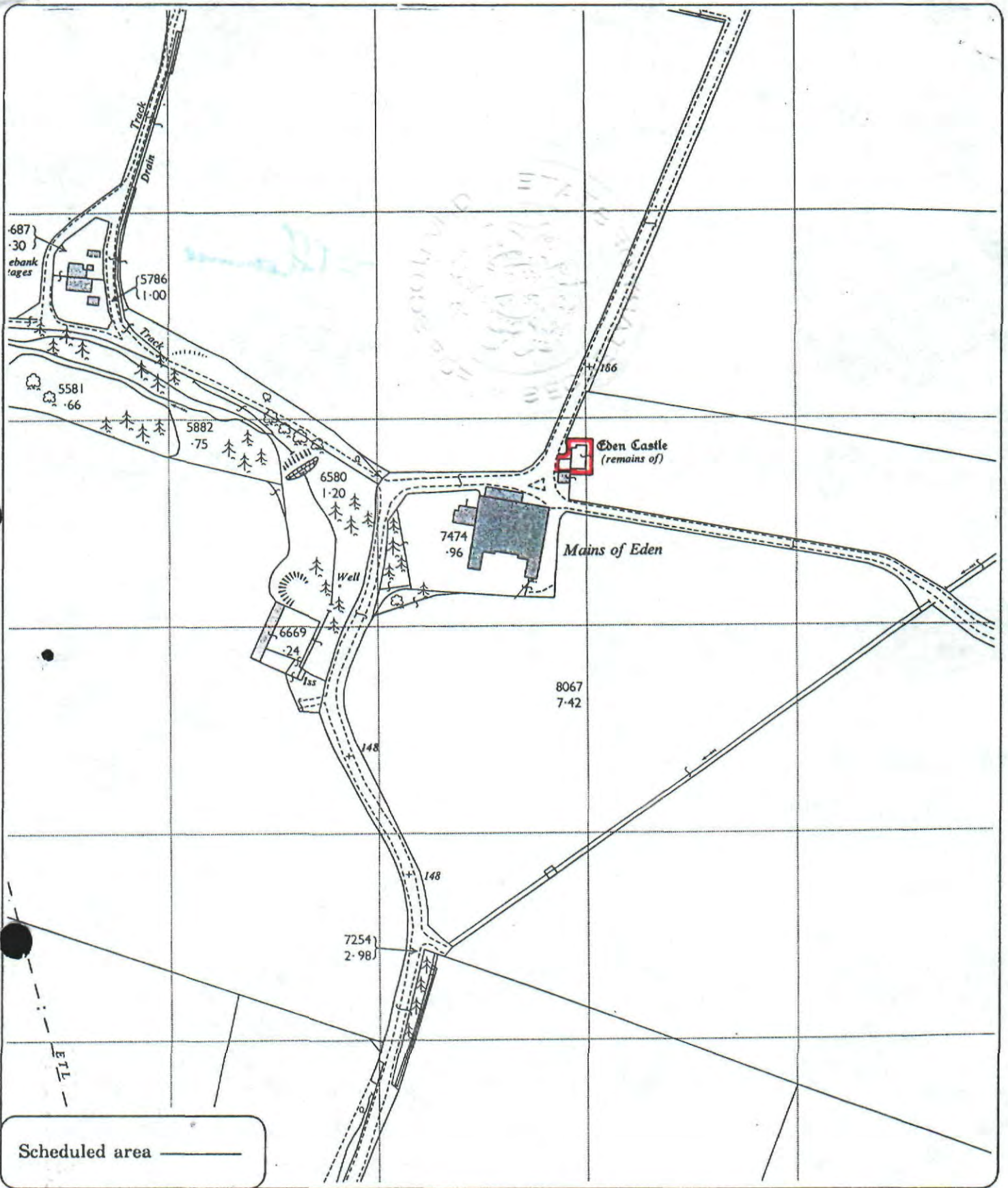
