THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Crombie Old Parish Church, Craigflower Estate, Torryburn comprises the ruin of the Old Parish Church of Crombie, which was the parish church of Crombie before the parishes of Crombie and Torry were united at a date prior to 1623. Crombie Church came to be used as a burial vault by the Colvilles of Ochiltree. The area to be scheduled is rectangular, extending 3m from the exterior walls and measuring 20.1m E-W by 10m, 4m N-S. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Torryburn and the County of Fife as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto, is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

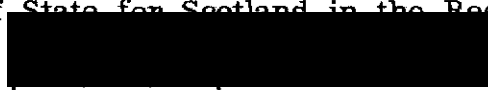

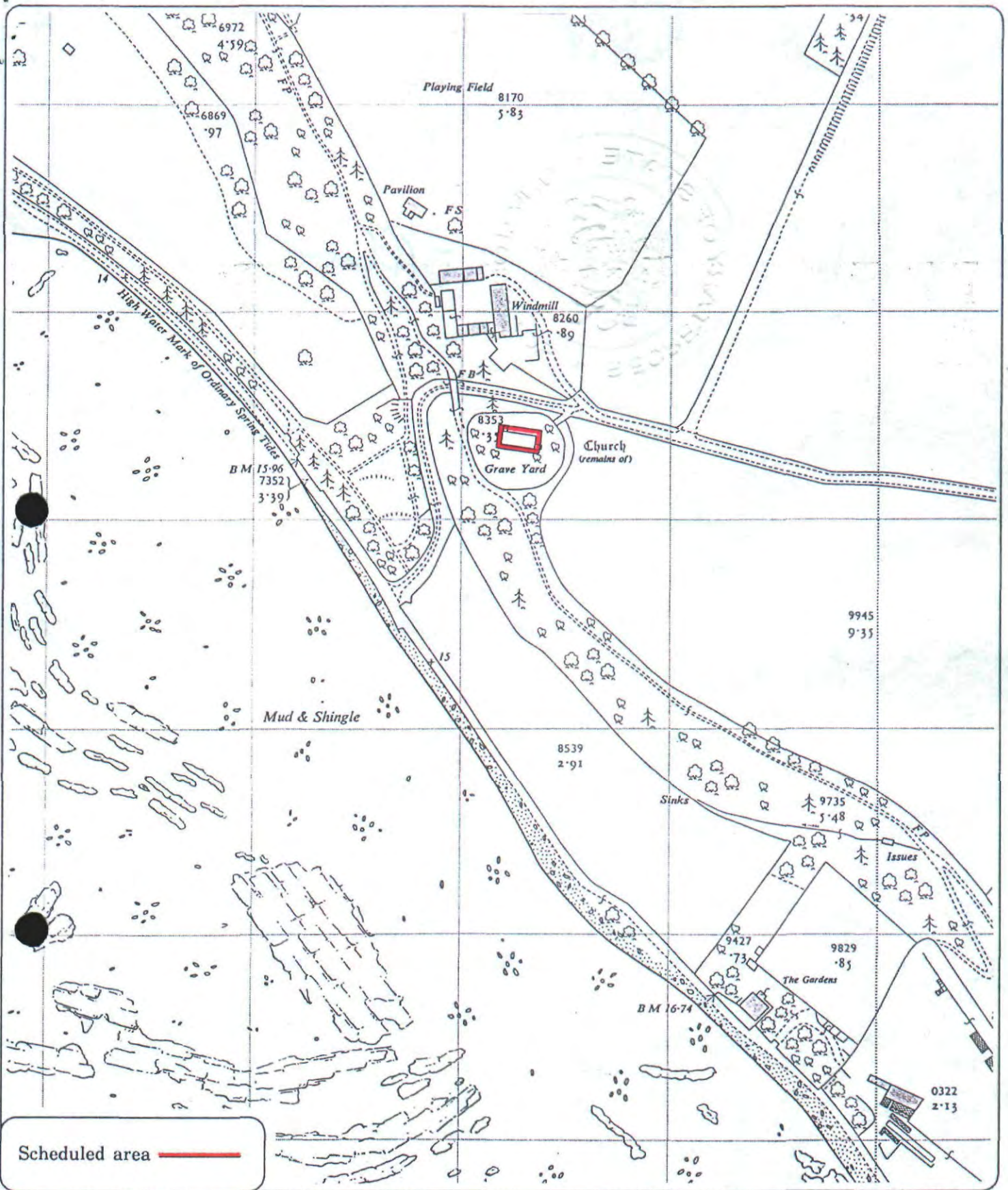

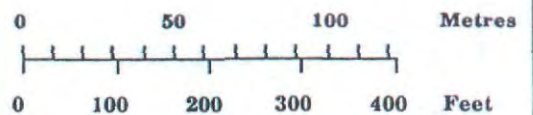
Crombie Old Parish Church,
