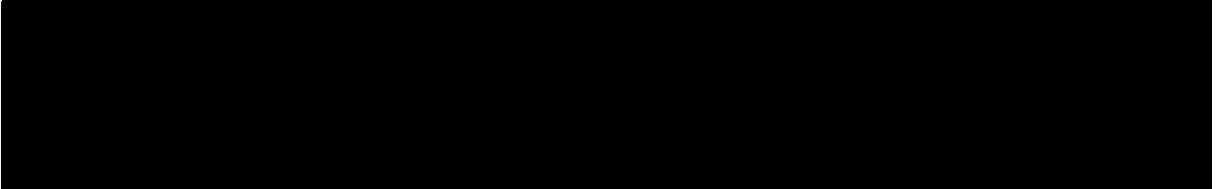

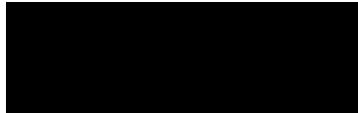
THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Gress Lodge, souterrain comprises a large and complex souterrain, an underground storehouse of Iron Age date, and associated deposits. The area to be scheduled is irregular on plan, bounded by the high-water mark of the shore on the SE, by the stream Abhainn Mhor on the NE, by the N edge of the access track to the shore on the SW and by the S edge of the track leading to the SE side of Gress Lodge on the NW. The area has maximum dimensions of 135m NE-SW by 43m NW-SE. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Stornoway and the County of Ross and Cromarty as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms part of the



hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

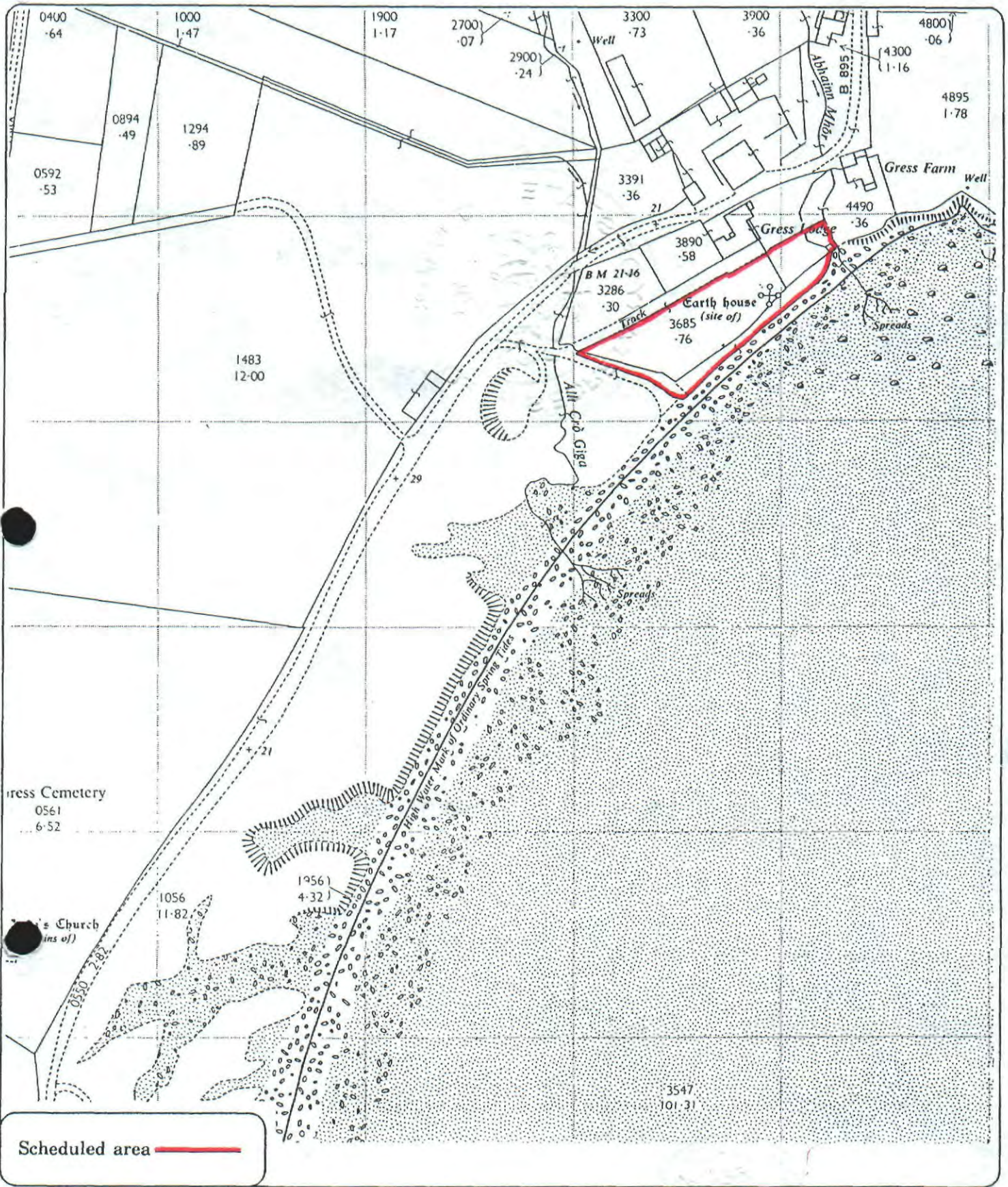

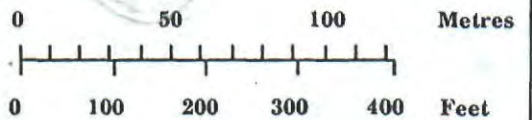
Gress Lodge, souterrain
