

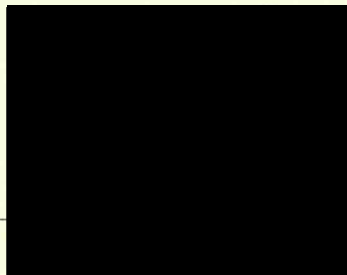
THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979 5705  
AMENDED ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The entry in the Schedule of monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the above Act in respect of the monument known as Newton, pit alignment 600m SE of, dated 6 August 1993 and recorded in the Division of the General Register of Sasines for the County of Midlothian on 26 October 1993 is hereby in accordance with the provisions of section 1(5) of the above Act amended to describe the exclusions to the scheduled monument. The corridor of the A68 road lying between NGR NT 33730 69433 and NT 33788 69416 to the north and NGR NT 33727 69398 and NT 33786 69380 to the south and the post-and-rail fences that bound the road corridor in this location are specifically excluded from the scheduling.

The monument known as Newton, pit alignment 600m SE of comprises part of a pit alignment, probably an agricultural boundary of prehistoric date, represented by cropmarks visible on oblique aerial photographs. The area to be scheduled encompasses the visible features together with an area around them in which traces of associated activity may be expected to survive. The area has maximum dimensions of 520m N-S by 60m E-W. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Newton and the County of Midlothian as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto



, is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

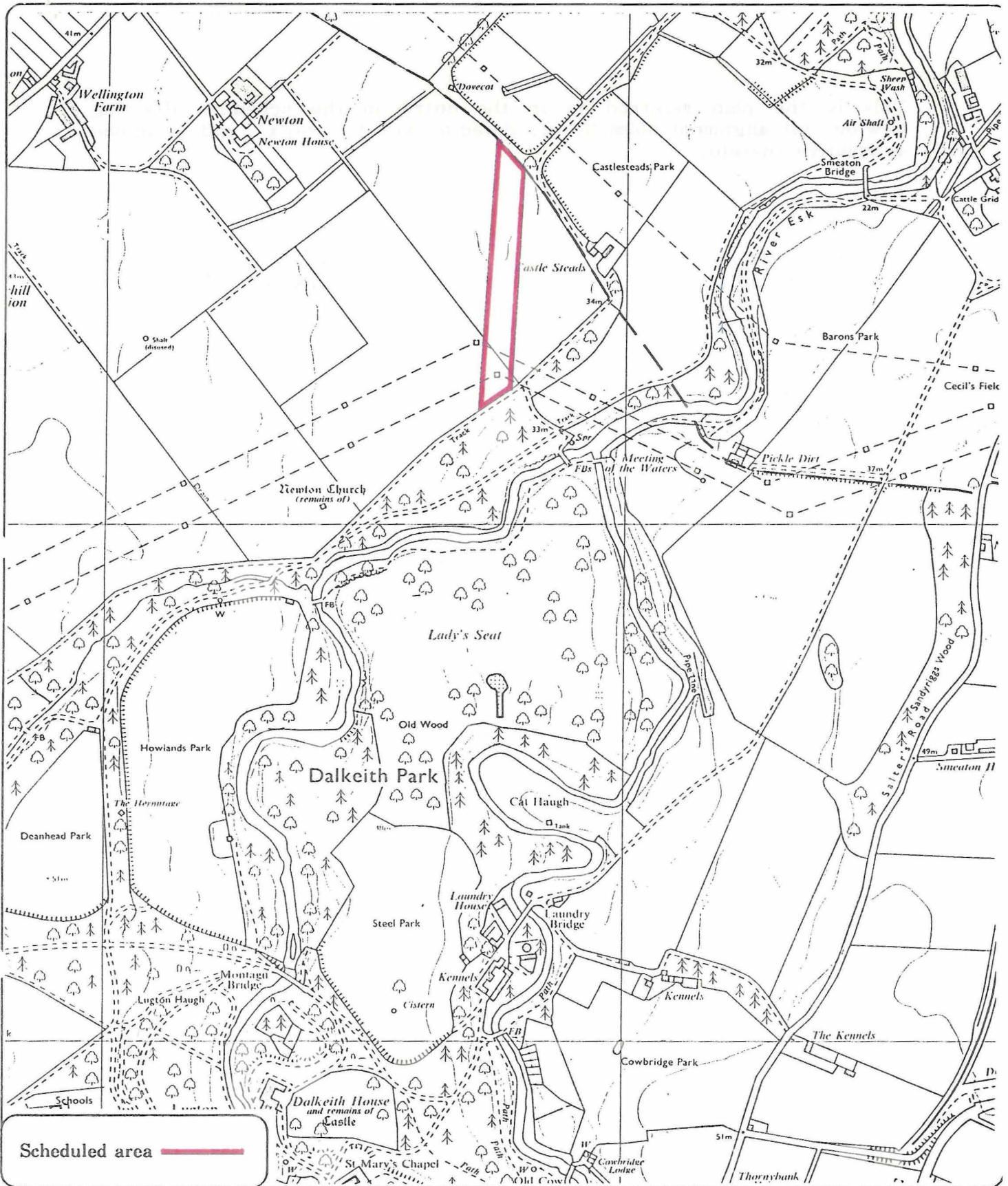
