ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Castle Steads, pit alignment 150m NE of comprises a pit alignment, probably an agricultural boundary of prehistoric date, represented by cropmarks visible on oblique aerial photographs. The area to be scheduled encompasses all the visible features together with an area around them in which traces of associated activity may be expected to survive. The area is rectilinear in shape measuring 100m NW-SE by 60m. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Inveresk and the County of Midlothian as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms part of the Town and lands of Castlesteads in the Parishes of Newton and Inveresk

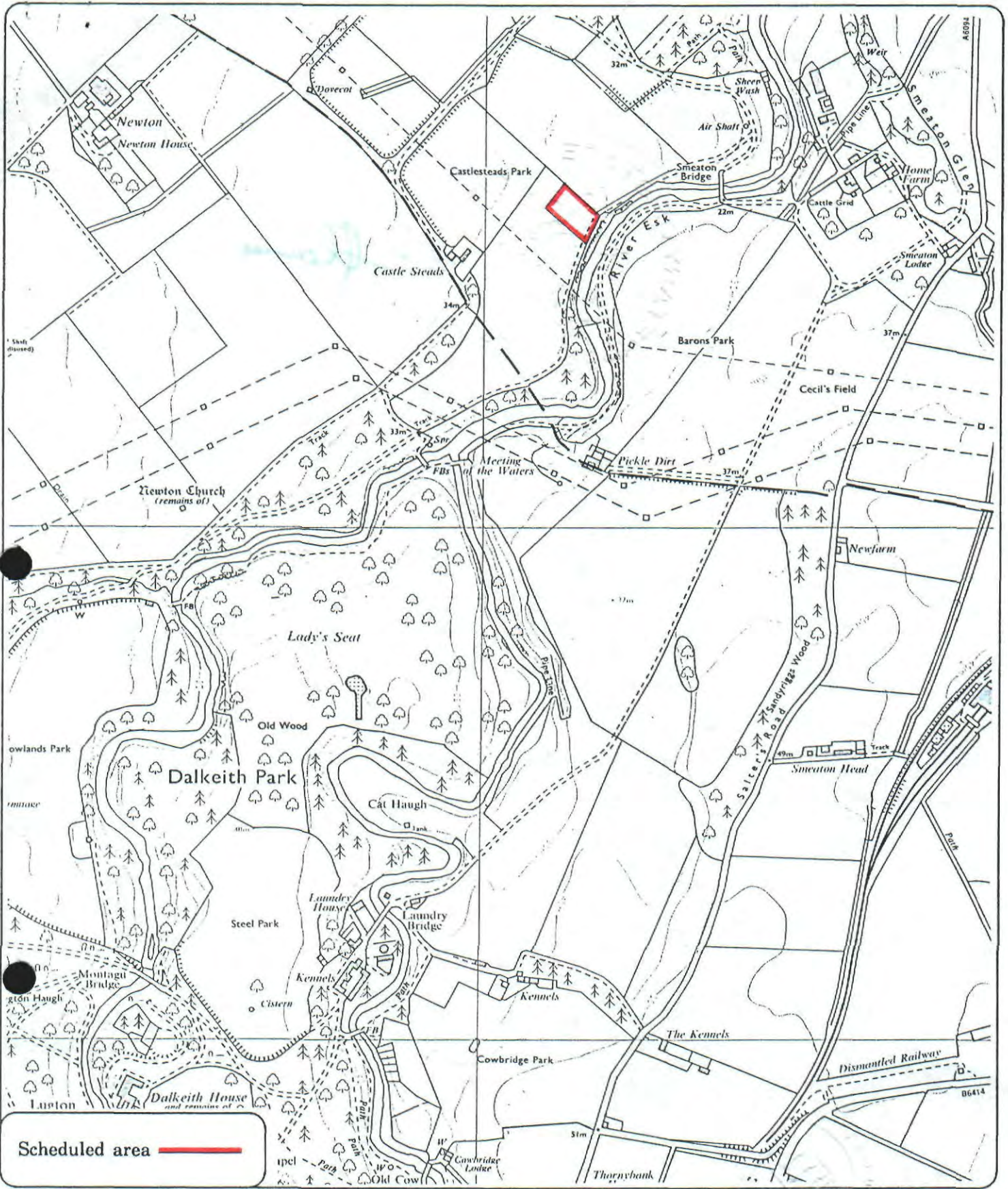

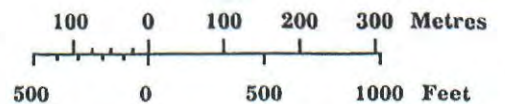
