ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Loch na Berie, broch and causeway comprises the remains of a broch with associated external structures and internal occupation deposits, dating from the Iron Age to the late 1st millennium AD. The area to be scheduled encompasses the broch and its causeway together with an area around them in which traces of associated structures and deposits may be expected to survive. It is irregular in shape with maximum dimensions of 100m E-W by 50m. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Uig and the County of Ross and Cromarty as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

 is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

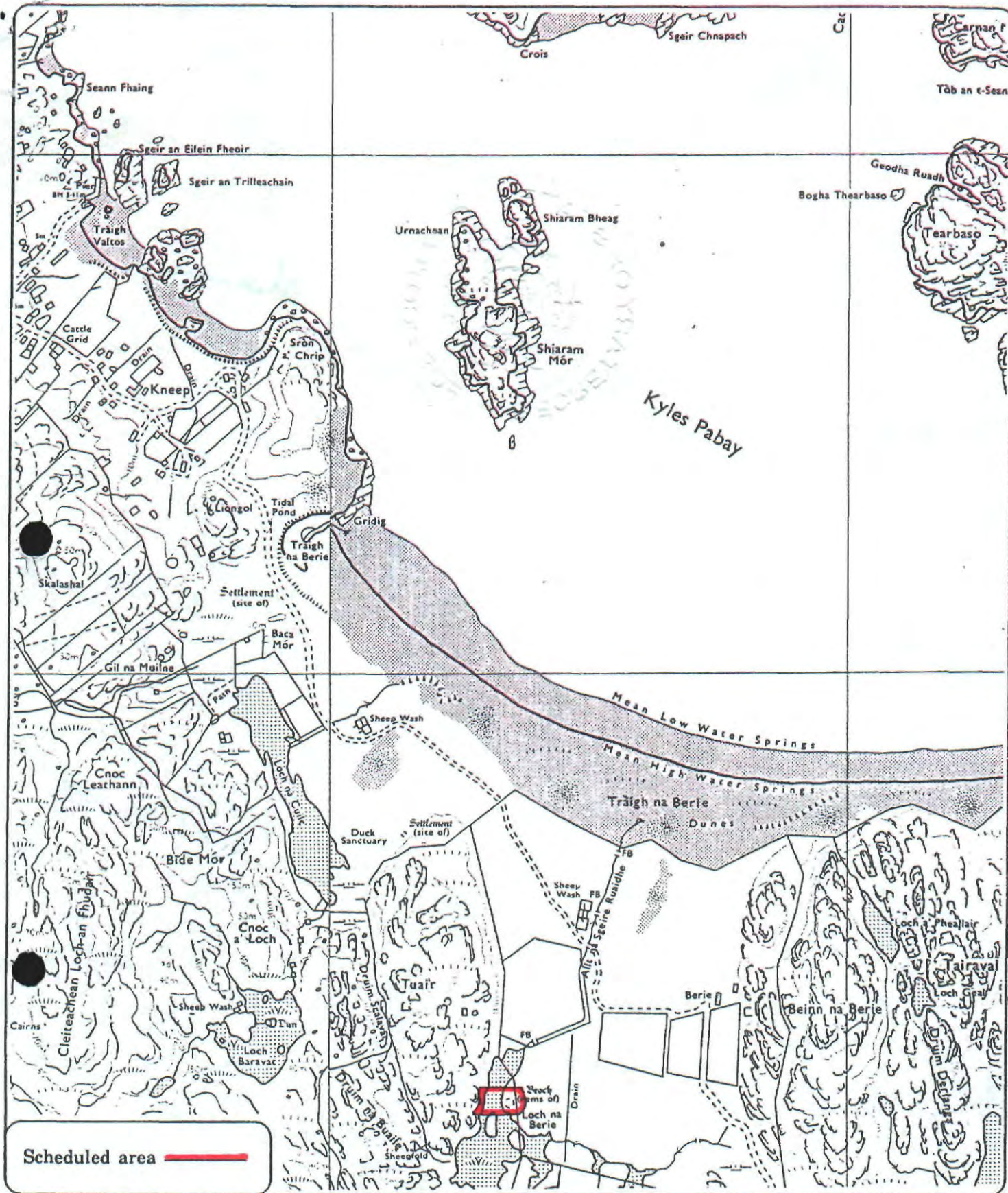

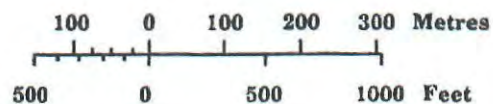
Loch na Berie, broch and
