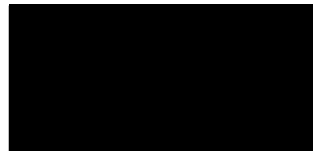

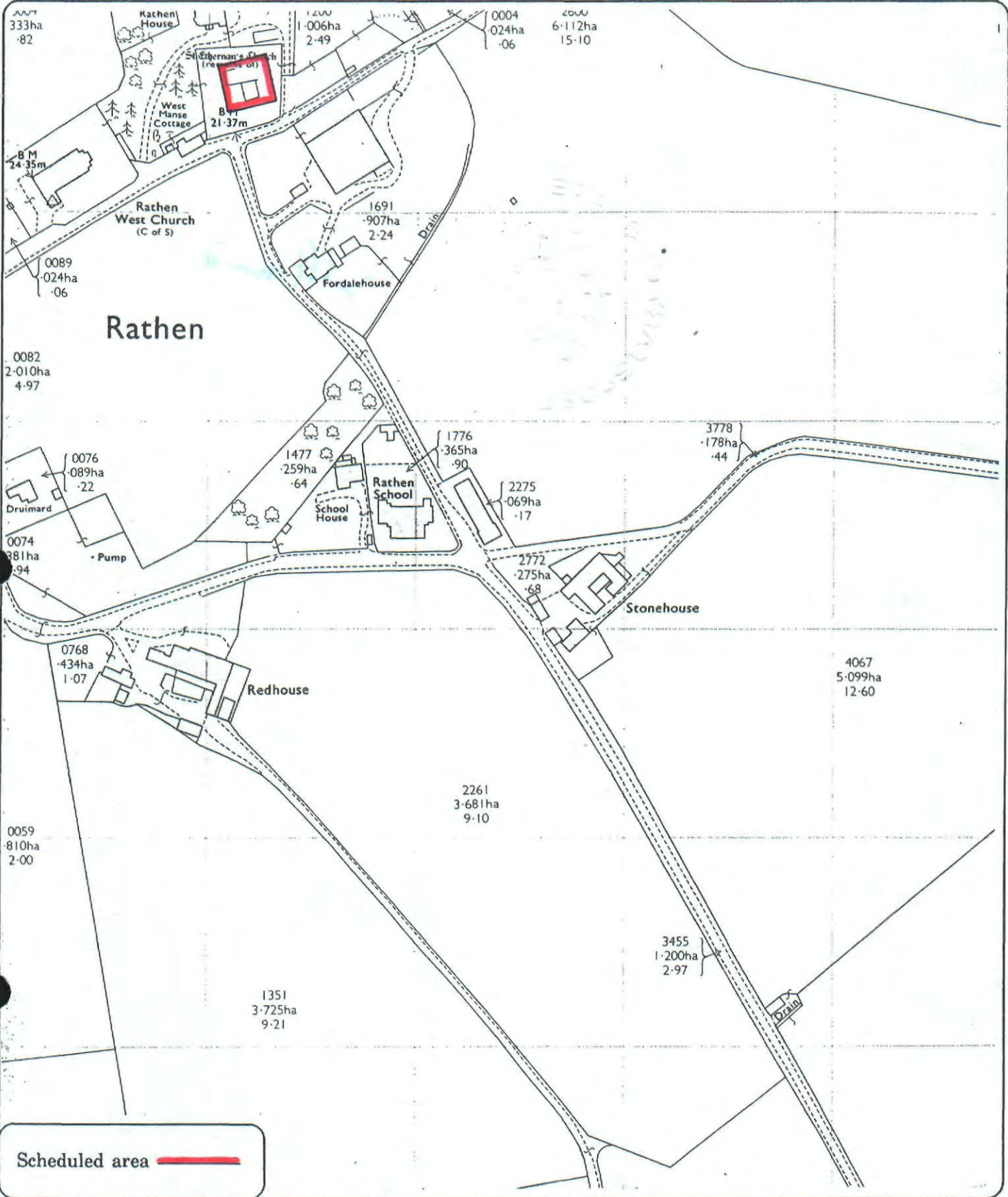
The monument known as St Ethernan's, Rathen old parish church comprises the remains of St Ethernan's, the old parish church of Rathen. The present edifice dates from the seventeenth century and occupies the site of an earlier church, first on record as a parsonage between 1207 and 1228. The area to be scheduled is rectangular, extending 2m from the exterior walls of the church and measuring a maximum of 22.25m N-S by 24m E-W. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Rathen and the County of Aberdeen as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.
