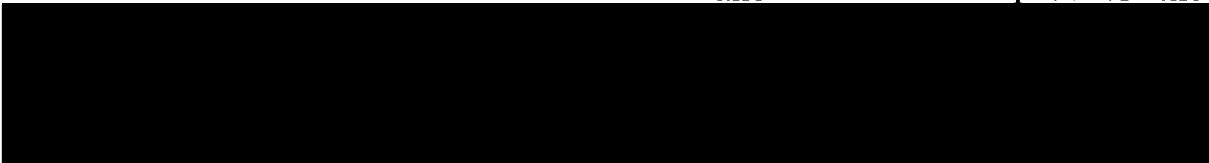

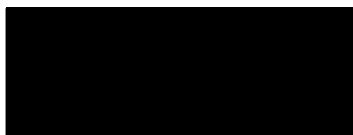
THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Fletcherfield, enclosure 100m SE of comprises the remains of an enclosure of prehistoric date represented by cropmarks visible on oblique aerial photographs. It is likely to represent a former enclosed settlement of the later prehistoric period although it may instead represent an earlier ritual enclosure such as a henge. The area to be scheduled encompasses the enclosure and an area around it in which traces of associated activity may be expected to survive. It is circular with a diameter of 80m. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Kirriemuir and the County of Angus as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms part of the

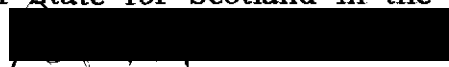

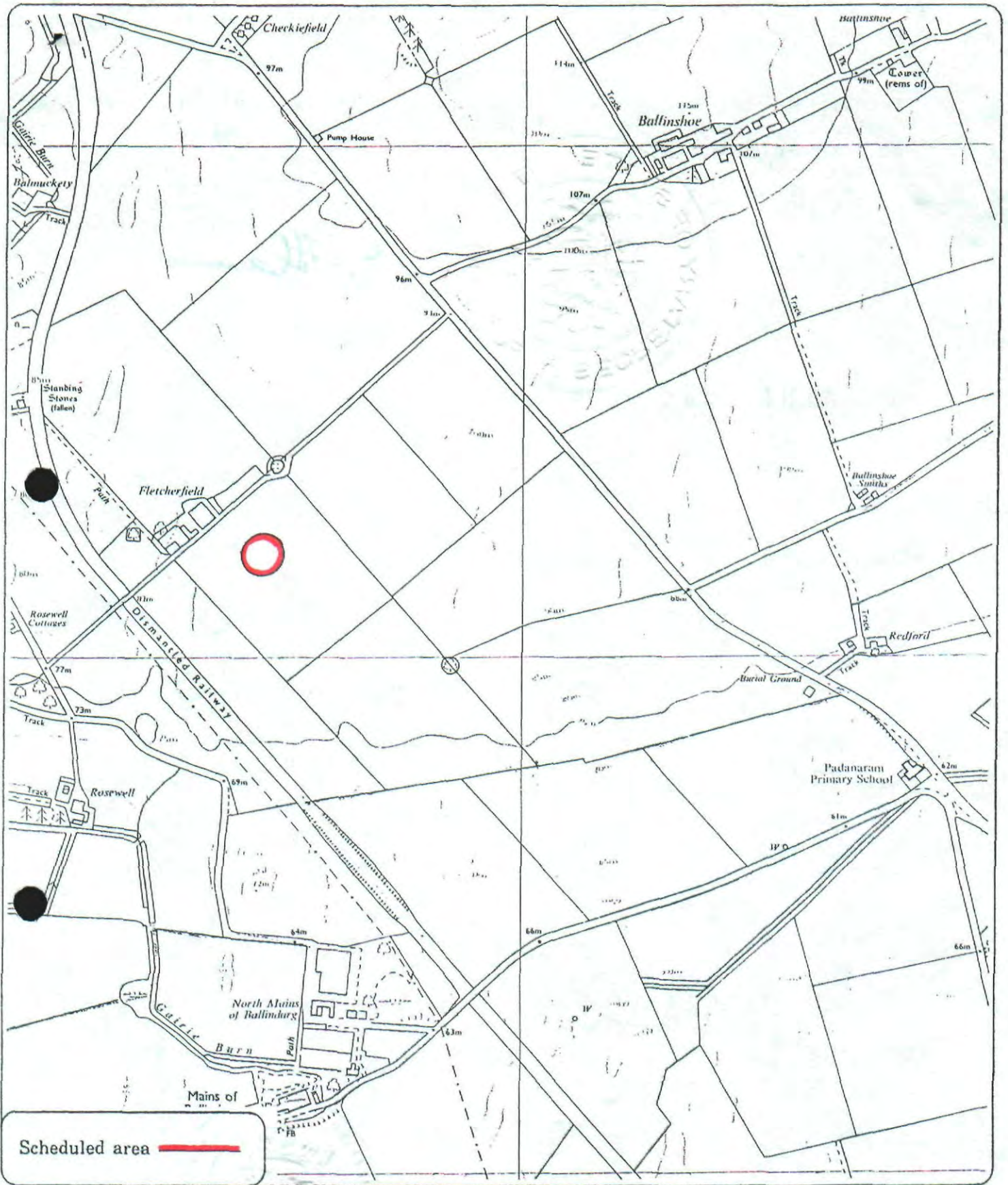

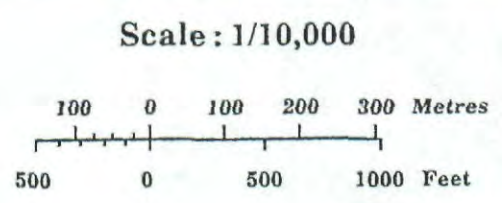
