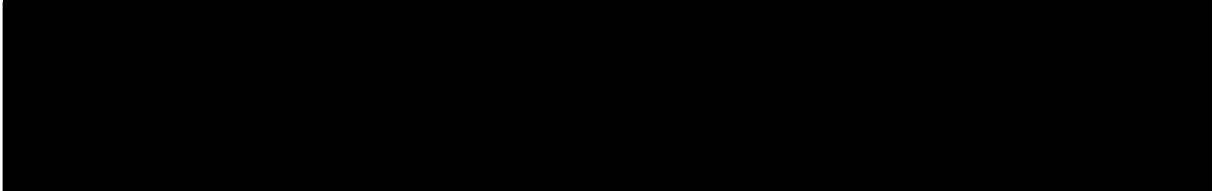

THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Whitestone Cairn, cairn, Harestone Hill comprises the remains of a cairn likely to represent a burial monument of Bronze Age date. It survives as a prominent stony mound on the summit of Harestone Hill. The area to be scheduled encompasses the cairn and an area around it in which traces of associated activity may be expected to survive. It is circular with a diameter of 40m. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Yester and the County of East Lothian as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and



hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

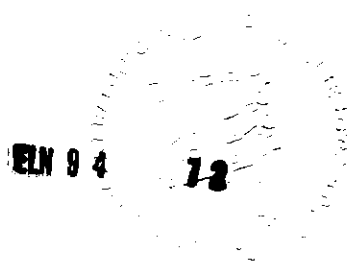

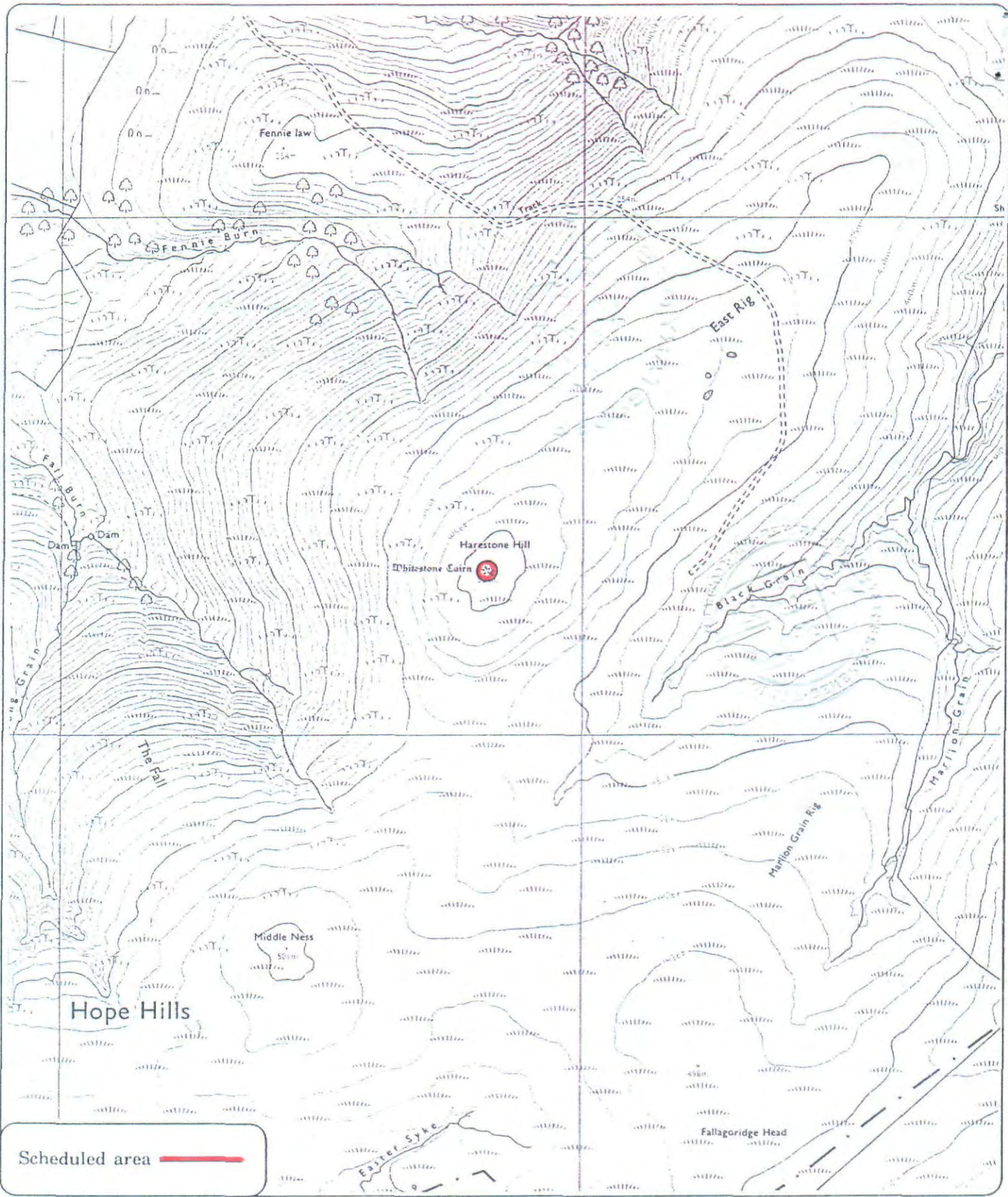

Scheduled area

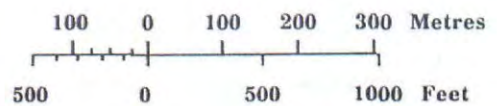
Whitestone Cairn, cairn,
