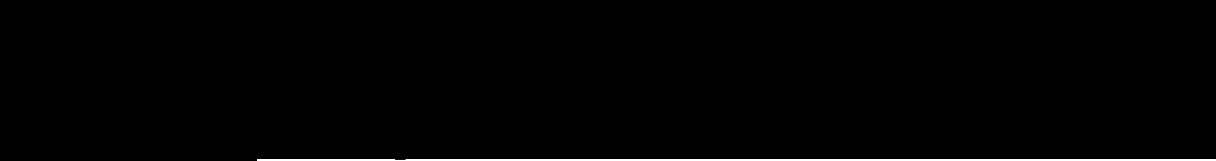

ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Sidhean Cleite Thog, cairn and settlement, Scaliscro comprises a large mound, probably the remains of a prehistoric cairn, on which are set the ruins of a farmstead. The latter was cleared of inhabitants before 1845. The area to be scheduled is circular, 95m in diameter, centred on the centre of the house, to include the house and associated structures and the underlying cairn or mound together with an area around them in which evidence relating to their construction and use may survive. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Uig and the County of Ross and Cromarty as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms part of the



, is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

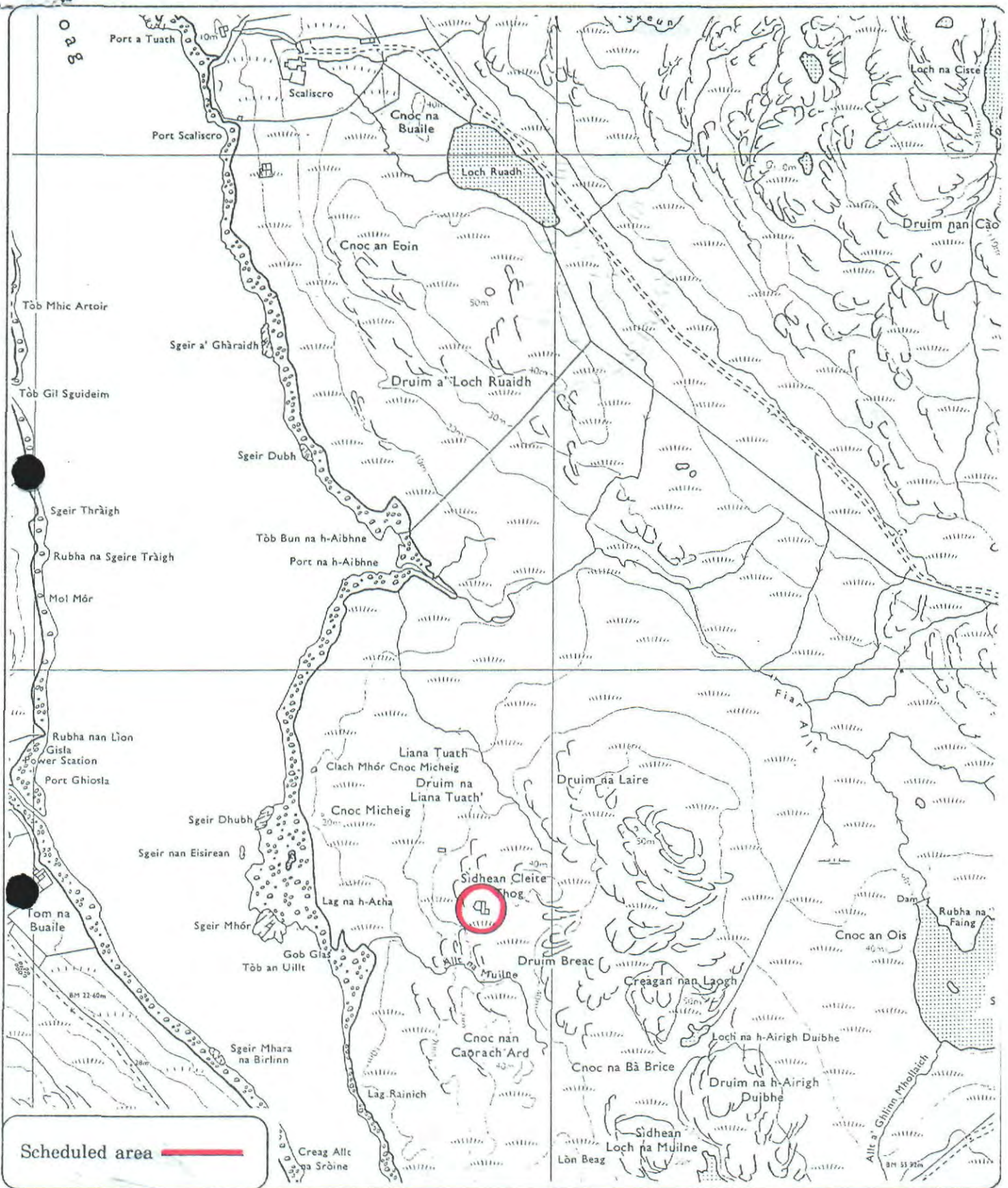

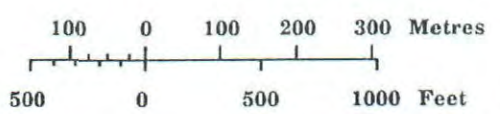
