ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Litterty Hill, cairn comprises the remains of a round burial cairn, and other burial remains, probably of the Bronze Age. It stands on Litterty Hill, on the E side of the Tore of Troup, a steep-sided valley. The area to be scheduled measures 100m in diameter to include the burial cairn and the adjacent cists and also an area around and between them in which further remains associated with their construction and use may survive. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Aberdour and the County of Aberdeen as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms part



is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

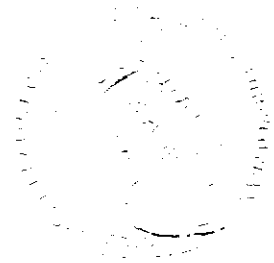

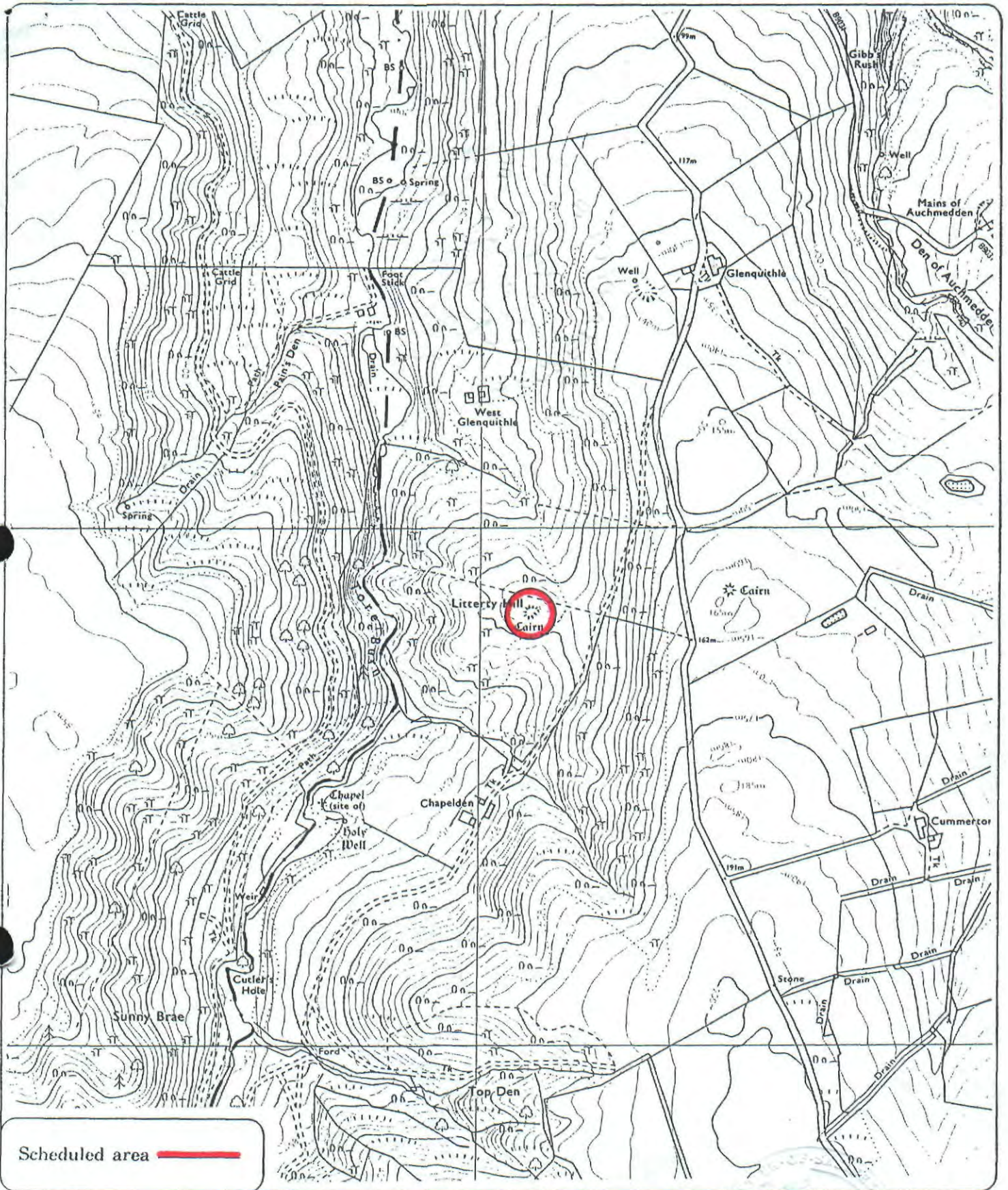
