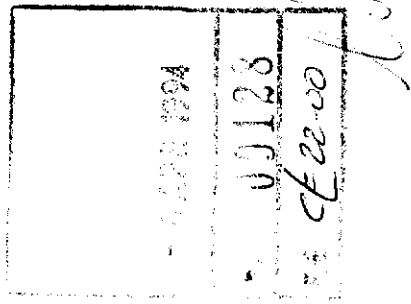

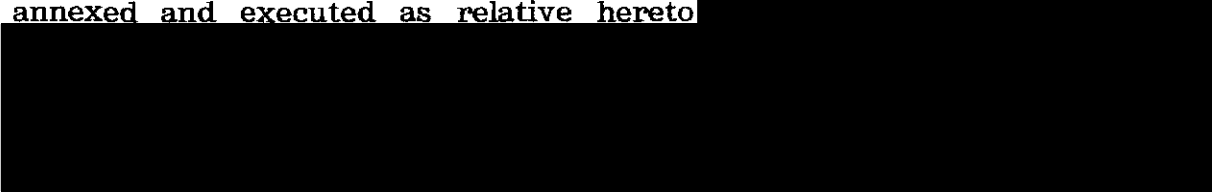

THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Cummerton, cairn 600m NNW of comprises a circular burial cairn, probably dating from the Bronze Age. It stands on the crest of a hill to the E of the Tore of Troup. It is one of a series of broadly contemporary burial cairns and other remains which survive nearby. The area to be scheduled measures 100m in diameter and is centred on the burial cairn. It includes the burial cairn and an area around it in which further remains associated with its construction and use may survive. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Aberdour and the County of Aberdeen as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto



is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.
