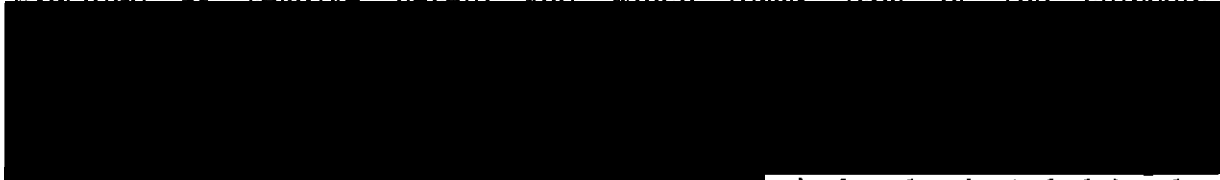

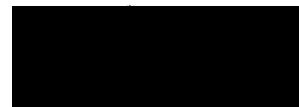

The monument known as Fedderate Castle comprises the upstanding remains of Fedderate Castle, a 15th-century stronghold overlying a 13th-century defensive site. The area to be scheduled is square with sides measuring 24m, and is defined by the surrounding post and wire fence. The monument, which lies in the Parish of New Deer and the County of Aberdeen as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms part of the subjects



is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

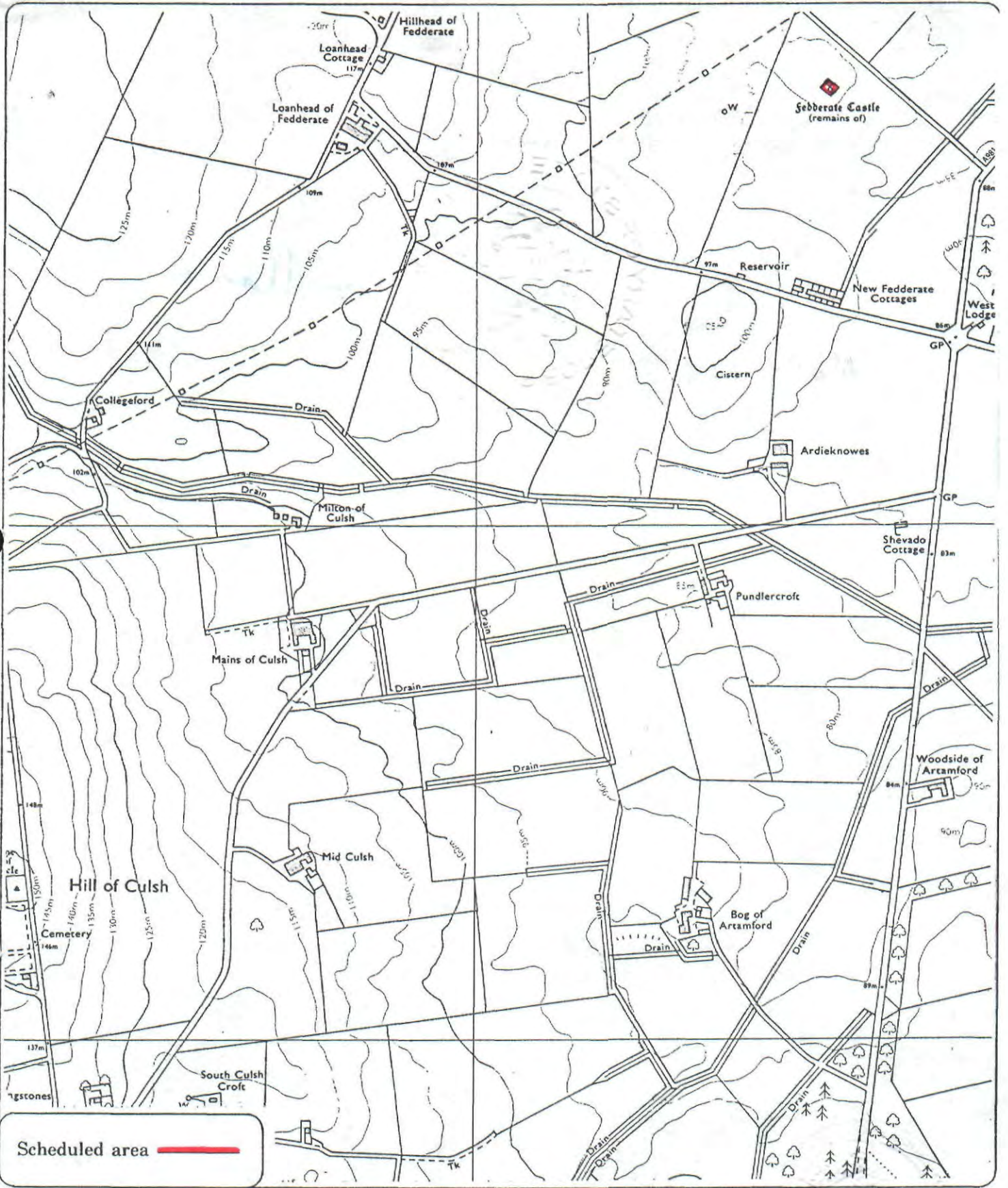
