ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Dun Eibhinn, fort, Colonsay comprises a prehistoric or early historic fort which occupies a detached and prominent rocky knoll situated in the central massif of Colonsay. The area to be scheduled measures 100m from N to S by 60m transversely, to include the fort and an area around in which associated remains are likely to survive. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Colonsay and Oronsay and the County of Argyll as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms part of the subjects

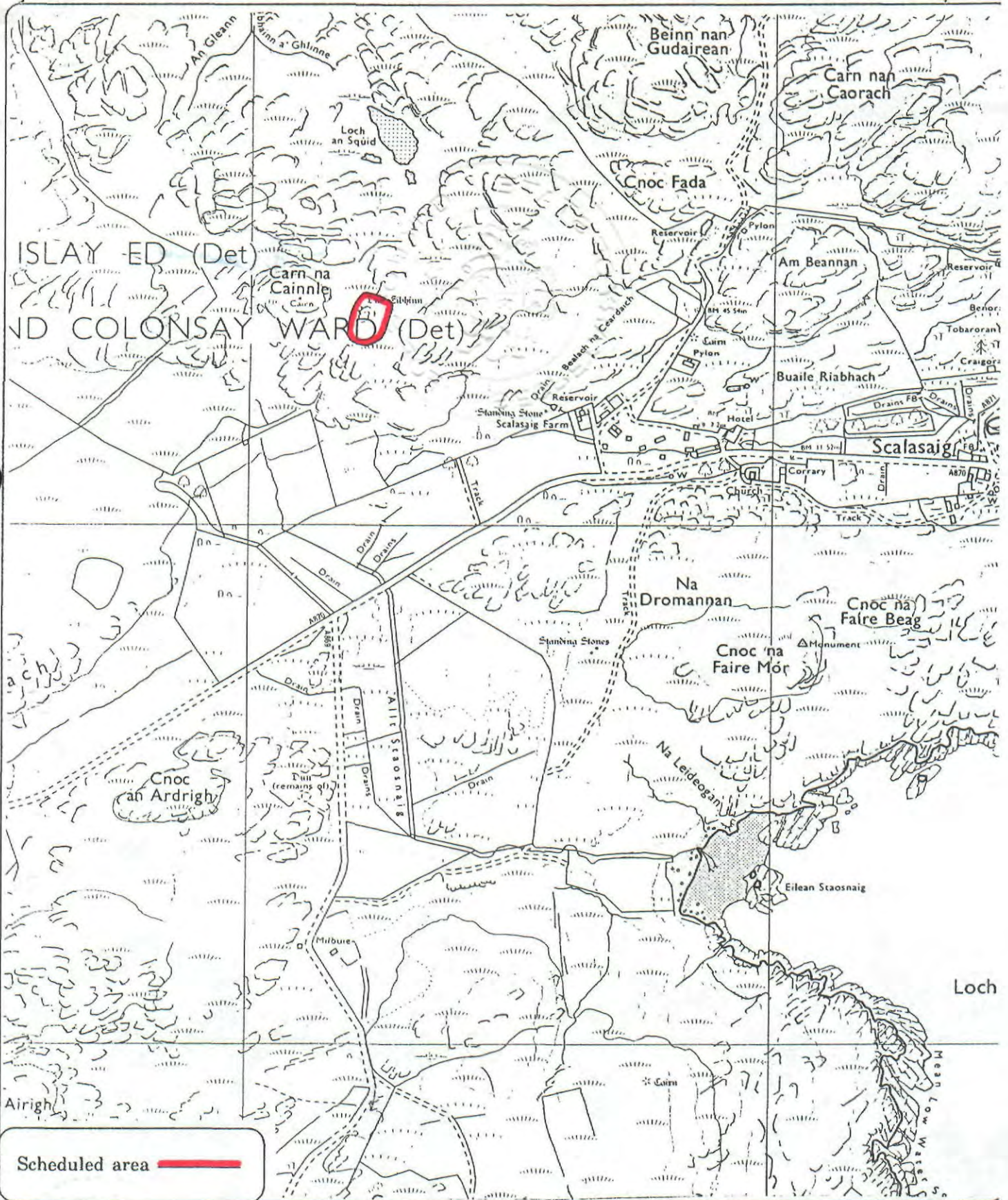

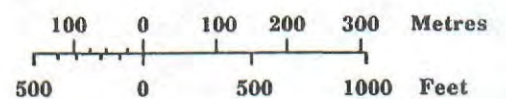
Dun Eibhinn, fort, Colonsay
